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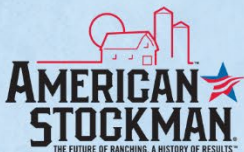

Directions to the American Royal Complex

From the Northwest: (St. Joseph): Take I-29 South to I-635 South, take I-635 South to I-70 East, take I-70 East to I-670 East, take Genessee Street/Wyoming Street/Hy-Vee Arena exit (Exit 1B) and turn right onto Genessee Street.

From the Northeast: (Iowa, Liberty, MO) Take I-35 South for one half mile to I-70 East, take I-70 East for one mile to I-670 West, take Wyoming Street exit (Exit 1B), take the off ramp to Genessee Street – turn left onto Genessee Street.

From the West: Take I-70 East & use Exit 421B to merge onto I-670 East, use Genessee Street exit (Exit 1B) and turn right onto Genessee Street.

From the East: Take I-70 West to I-670 West, exit at Wyoming/Genessee/Hy-Vee Arena exit (Exit 1B). Turn left onto Genessee Street.

From the South: Take I-35 North to I-670 West, exit at Wyoming/Genessee/Hy-Vee Arena exit (Exit 1B). Turn left onto Genessee Street.

As you approach the Hy-Vee Arena (formerly Kemper Arena), follow signage on Genessee Street. Turn West onto State Line Road from Genessee Street. State Line Road immediately curves to the South.

2023 American Royal Animal Health Requirements

Health Requirements for All Exhibitors: The American Royal Animal Health Requirements may be stricter than those required by the Missouri Department of Agriculture, Division of Animal Health. In order to exhibit at the American Royal, you must adhere to the following requirements. **Please note:** Health Requirements are subject to change; the following requirements are posted as of July 1, 2023.

All animals exhibited must have a current health certificate/certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) issued within thirty (30) days before the show. The certificate must be issued from the state of origin by a licensed accredited veterinarian. The animals must have individual identification stating that each animal has been examined and/or are free of infectious, contagious, & communicable disease.

The following must be used as the official identification number:

Swine: Federal 840 tag number (Ear notches will be used as a secondary form of identification).

Steers: Federal 840 tag number

Lambs: USDA Scrapie ID

Goats: USDA Scrapie ID

Breeding Cattle: Registration tattoo with papers or official ID tag (Federal 840 Tag preferred).

Official veterinarians will maintain an office in the American Royal building. All livestock entering the show will be subject to examination by a show and/or State Veterinarian upon arrival to and/or during the show. Any animal, of any species, showing evidence of infectious, contagious, and/or communicable disease will be immediately withdrawn from the show, removed from the grounds, and/or held in quarantine at owner's risk and expense. These animals must remain in the quarantine area while on the grounds. Failure to cooperate with any precautions seen fit by the American Royal staff and/or show/State veterinarians may result in disqualification. There will be no refunds of any entry fees for animals withdrawn from the show.

Health Inspections for All Exhibitors: Upon arrival, animals will be briefly examined in their trailers. Please have health papers available for this inspection. Designated inspection locations for each type of livestock are listed below:

- Swine:
 - o The designated location for complete swine health checks will be under the viaduct South of Governor's Exposition Building. Upon approval of State Veterinarians, swine will be allowed to unload and stall.
- Lambs & Goats:
 - o After unloading on the East side of Lower Exhibition Hall, a complete health check will be conducted at the top of the ramp in Upper Exhibition Hall. Upon the approval from the State Veterinarians, lambs & goats should proceed to stalling.
- Cattle:
 - o All cattle will be inspected at the vehicle entry gate and then will be allowed to unload. Cattle ultimately must be individually viewed by State Veterinarians in their stalls. It is the responsibility of all livestock exhibitors to have their health papers checked by the State Veterinarians. Papers must be checked before animals will be allowed to show.

The American Royal Management reserves the right to change and/or modify vet check procedures as necessary.

Health Requirements for Out of State Exhibitors: If a permit is necessary for your animals to enter the State of Missouri, an accredited veterinarian needs to request the permit from the Missouri Department of Agriculture (573)751- 3377, not more than **15 days prior to arrival** at the American Royal Complex. Consult your veterinarian for interpretation of the requirements outlined on the next page. **All animals moving interstate for exhibition must have official individual identification on a health certificate.**

Cattle

Brucellosis:

- a) Breeding cattle from Brucellosis-free states may enter without a Brucellosis test.
- b) All breeding cattle, 18 months of age and over, from Brucellosis Class A states must be tested and negative within 30 days of the show.
- c) Herds that are certified for Brucellosis may enter on their herd number. The herd number and test date must be recorded on the health certificate.

Steers: All steers must be individually identified on a current health certificate which states they are free from warts and ringworm as well as infectious, contagious, and communicable disease. No Brucellosis test needed.

Tuberculosis:

All breeding cattle, 6 months of age or over must meet one of the following requirements:

- a) Originate from a Tuberculosis-free state
 - All Michigan origin animals must be tuberculosis tested prior to entry into Missouri. Animals originating from Michigan require an entry permit.
- b) Originate from a Tuberculosis-accredited free herd. The herd number and current test date must be recorded on the health certificate
- c) Test negative within 60 days

Lambs & Goats

All lambs and goats must be individually identified and must have an official Scrapie ID that lists their flock of origin and individual number. If lambs or goats have had ringworm or fungus, lesions must have dried and healed. Any animal found to have open, draining wounds or active infectious diseases will be disqualified.

Swine

All swine must have an official Federal 840 tag. Ear notches will be used as a secondary form of verification. All swine are required to have an entry permit.

Brucellosis:

- a) Breeding Swine from Brucellosis-free states may enter without a Brucellosis test.
- b) Breeding Swine originating from Brucellosis stage 2 states must be negative within 60 days of the show.
- c) Herds that are certified for Brucellosis may enter on their herd number. The herd number and test date must be recorded on the health certificate.

Pseudorabies:

- a) Swine originating from a state classified as Stage V in the National Pseudorabies (PRV) Eradication Plan may exhibit without a Pseudorabies test.
- b) All other swine must be tested negative within 60 days prior to show except swine from a qualified pseudorabies free herd. The qualified herd number and date of last qualifying test must be recorded on the health certificate.

Special Requirements for Consignment Sale Cattle

Regardless of origin, consigned sale cattle must meet Missouri Health Requirements. Individual health certificates are required for each animal or lot consigned to a sale held in conjunction with the American Royal. All non-virgin bulls and bulls older than 24 months must be tested negative for Trichomoniasis with an official Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test by an approved diagnostic laboratory within 30 days of the sale. Sale managers shall arrange for veterinary services to issue health papers to new owners of consigned animals.

Vehicle Pass... \$20.00

Authorizes exhibitor to park in parking lot B. **Entry gates will be monitored at all times and there will be a \$10.00 per entry charge without a pass.** Exhibitors will pick up credentials at time of arrival.

VIP Vehicle Pass... \$100.00

Authorizes exhibitors to park 1 vehicle in parking lot A, located on the South side of the Livestock barns. VIP Parking will allow exhibitors to park closer to their livestock. No campers or trailers are allowed with this pass. **Entry gates will be monitored at all times.** There will be a limited quantity of VIP passes available for purchase.

Exhibitor Badge... \$20.00

Authorizes admittance to the grounds of the American Royal Complex. Each exhibitor is required to purchase at least one badge on their entry form. *Please wear your exhibitor badge at all times and/or have it readily available.* **A \$10.00 grounds admission will be charged upon arrival for each person, each time, each day without a badge.** Badges and vehicle passes may be ordered on entry forms and picked up upon arrival. Badges and passes will **NOT** be mailed. Badges and Parking passes may also be purchased at the American Royal Livestock Office.

All fees must be paid in U.S. funds.

2023 Changes & Reminders

Market Exhibitors (*Steers, Lambs- wethers only, Goats- wethers only, Barrows*)

- All market exhibitors are required to complete a Quality Assurance program. Examples include: Youth for the Quality Care of Animals, Quality Counts, Beef Quality Assurance, Pork Quality Assurance, or other programs approved by the American Royal. The program name and certificate number will be required on all market entry forms. Exhibitors failing to submit this information will have entries returned as incomplete and will be assessed the \$10 re-processing fee.



Exhibitor Age Requirements

- All junior exhibitors showing a market animal, wether dam ewe, or wether dam doe must be no younger than 7 years old and no older than 21 years old as of January 1st, 2023.
- Junior breeding heifer exhibitors must follow their respective junior breed association age requirements.
- Purebred/Crossbred breeding gilt exhibitors must be no older than 21 years of age as of January 1st 2023, but the member must be able to exhibit their pig on their own with no assistance from ANYONE, including parents, siblings, NJSA/Team Purebred Junior Board or Staff, American Royal Staff, etc.



Steers

- Federal 840 ID tags are the official identification for steers are required. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Swine

- Market Barrow weight range will be from 230 – 300 lbs.
- There will be a **15lb** tolerance from the declared weight and all animals outside of the **15lb** tolerance will be disqualified.



Market Lambs

- 2023 American Royal Market Lamb Show will be classified into 2 Divisions: White Face-Influenced market lambs (i.e. Dorset, Southdown, Dorper, etc., and crosses using white face breeds i.e. speckle face) and Black Face market lambs.
- There will be a **7lb** tolerance from the declared weight and all animals outside of the **7lb** tolerance will be disqualified
- Champion and Reserve in each division of the black face market lambs and the Champion white face-influenced market lamb will qualify for the Junior Premium Livestock Auction and **must sell** through the auction.

Market Goats



- There will be a **5lb** tolerance from the declared weight and all animals outside of the **5lb** tolerance will be disqualified.
- Champion and Reserve in each division of market goats will qualify for the Junior Premium Livestock Auction and **must sell** through the auction.



Wether Dam Ewes

- 2023 American Royal Wether Dam Ewe Show will be classified into 2 Divisions: White Face-Influenced Ewes (i.e. Dorset, Southdown, Dorper, etc., and crosses using white face breeds i.e. speckle face) and Black Face Ewes.

2023 Changes & Reminders Continued



Junior Premium Livestock Auction

- Champion and Reserve in each division of market goats will qualify for the Junior Premium Livestock Auction and **must sell** through the auction. Champion and Reserve in each division of the black face market lambs and the Champion white face-influenced market lamb will qualify for the Junior Premium Livestock Auction and **must sell** through the auction. Please see more detailed information under each species.
- All market animal exhibitors that qualify for the Junior Premium Livestock Auction will be required to complete an Animal Husbandry Form, which can be found at www.americanroyal.com. **All medications, vaccinations, injections, medical treatments and any foreign substances administered, in any form or manner, from the ownership deadline (August 15, 2023) through Junior Premium Livestock Auction must be recorded.** The American Royal strongly advises all exhibitors to maintain this form from time of ownership and bring with them to the American Royal to ensure accuracy in record keeping.
- The Junior Premium Livestock Auction is a **terminal auction**.



Showmanship *(Based on age of exhibitor on January 1, 2023)*

Force Majeure and Government Regulation

In view of the fact that the American Royal is a non-profit association depending to a great degree upon the contribution and services of a substantial number of donors and volunteers, as well as the benefit provided by the American Royal to the general public through education and related services, the American Royal deems it appropriate and prudent to be excused from liability as set forth below in this paragraph. In the event of any cancellation of its events, operations, and activities by reason of force majeure and/or governmental action. Accordingly, the following shall apply to the operations and activities conducted by the American Royal Association:

Force Majeure: The American Royal Association is not liable for any delay or failure to perform its operations, activities, shows, and/or events to the extent such delay or failure results in a force majeure occurrence. A force majeure occurrence is defined as any occurrence arising from causes beyond the reasonable control of the American Royal Association that delays or prevents performance by the American Royal Association otherwise required by this agreement, including but not limited to: any

1. breakage or accident to equipment, machinery, or facilities;
2. any strikes, lock-outs, or other labor difficulties;
3. statutes, ordinances, regulations, orders, or rules issued by governmental authorities;
4. judicial decrees or orders;
5. acts of God;
6. animal diseases and/or quarantines;
7. wars, riots, or insurrections;
8. civil disobediences, public demonstrations, or sabotage;
9. fires, floods, explosions, or inclement weather;
10. inability to obtain necessary labor, materials, supplies, utilities, or transportation;
11. depressions, recessions, or other economic downturns;
12. embargoes or energy shortages; or
13. other causes beyond the American Royal Association's reasonable control.

Governmental Action: The American Royal Association shall not be liable for any delay or failure to perform its operations, activities, shows, and events to the extent such delay or failure results from the American Royal Association's good faith compliance with applicable governmental statutes, ordinances, regulations, orders, rules, or other directives, including but not limited to compliance with governmental directives concerning public health and safety, animal disease prevention, detection and response, including animal quarantine and/or destruction; and protection of the environment.

Homeland Security Systems Warning Statement: Evacuation of Livestock/Equine: During such times as deemed necessary by local, state, or federal authorities, the American Royal Association and/or its officials may temporarily or permanently evacuate the American Royal Complex under the authority of the Homeland Security Act. Incidents such as, but not limited to, bomb threats, acts of war, declarations of war, code red of the Homeland Security System, etc. will be acted upon in accordance and cooperating with local, state, and federal authorities. Priority evacuation will be given to human life then livestock and/or equine. In such cases, exhibitors and/or contestant will turn over the care of their livestock or equine to the American Royal Association. Proper animal husbandry practices will be followed within reasonable expectations. At which time the evacuation notice is lifted, exhibitors/contestant will be allowed to reenter the American Royal Complex and claim their livestock or equine.

By making entry into the American Royal, you authorize the American Royal Association and its officials to detain your livestock/equine on these premises. Furthermore, you agree to hold harmless and without liability the American Royal Association, its officials, directors, officers, staff, and volunteers for those animals under the reasonable care of the show.

Fire Department Regulations: The following requirements are by order of the Kansas City, Missouri Fire Department. Livestock and Horse exhibitors must comply with requirements applicable to them.

1. All exhibitors providing a lounge in their stall area and using wood chips on the floor shall post “No Smoking by order of the Fire Marshall” signs.
2. All wood chips used in stall areas shall be kept back at least five (5) feet from main aisles and kept wet at all times.
3. All material used for decorations of stall and lounge shall be fire retardant.
4. Any extension cord wiring must be the heavy duty type installed in a neat manner.
5. Fire hoses are not to be used for watering livestock.
6. Fire lanes around and within the buildings are not to be infringed upon.
7. Exit doors are to be left clear and accessible for emergency use.

Amending Rules: The management reserves the right to interpret and amend all rules.

Camper Parking: There will be no camper or mobile home parking on the grounds of the American Royal. Camping space is reserved for vendors only.

Event Cancellation: In case of cancellation of the event or unavailability of the event due to war, governmental action or order, act of God, fire, strike, labor disputes, or any other cause beyond the American Royal's control, this Agreement shall terminate, and the exhibitor shall be entitled to the return of the fees for the event, less the prorated share allocated to the American Royal of the expenses incurred by the Royal in connection with the event. Refund of the Fees as provided in this section shall be the exclusive remedy of the exhibitor against the American Royal in case the event is canceled or rescheduled through war, governmental action or order, acts of God, fire, strike, labor disputes, or any other cause beyond the American Royal of and from all claims for damage and agrees that the American Royal shall have no obligation except the above stated refund. Requests for refunds must be submitted to the American Royal and are subject to the discretion of the American Royal. Refunds will not be issued for events that are less than 7 days away. A roll over of funds for future events is not allowed.

Feed and Bedding: Feed may be purchased from the Feed Room. Orders must be placed by 4:00 p.m. daily. Terms are cash or credit card. All feed bills MUST be paid in full before orders will be delivered.

All cattle ties in the barn and in the tie-out area will be bedded with material provided by the American Royal.

Additional bedding may be purchased from the Feed Room and/or exhibitors may bring their own.

Swine, lamb, and goat exhibitors may purchase bedding from the Feed Room or may bring their own. Hogs must use shavings. Lamb and goats may use shavings or carpeting.

The Association is likewise not responsible or liable for damage or injury to any article or animal, or the destruction, injury, or disappearance of such article or animal. Each exhibitor is solely responsible and liable for any loss, injury, or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from any article or animal. Exhibitors agree to protect and indemnify the Association against all claims, legal, or other proceedings and all incidental or related expenses, losses, or damages, as well as damage or injury to any person or property, caused by the exhibitor or his/her employees, independent contractors, or any article or animal.

Health and Safety: Exhibitors and family members are asked to follow all health and safety guidelines. By participating or attending the American Royal, you are acknowledging that an inherent risk of exposure to contagious illnesses exists in any public place where people are present. By attending the American Royal, you and any guests voluntarily assume all risks and agree to not hold the American Royal Association, City of Kansas City, Missouri, County of Jackson; or any of their affiliates, directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, or volunteers liable for any illness or injury.

Registry of Breeding Animals: All animals in breeding classes must be recorded in the recognized books of record for their respective breeds. Exhibitors must produce a Certificate of Registry at the request of the management any time during the show. Only books of record recognized by the United States Department of Agriculture will be accepted.

Official registered name and registration number of all animals entered in the breeding classes are to be given on the entry form. Erroneous entries may result in disqualification. Animals registered to more than one breed may only be entered in one breed show.

Exhibitors showing in the wether dam doe show or wether dam ewe show will not be required to show registration papers but will be required to submit DNA.

Video Surveillance: Premises used by the American Royal are subject to video surveillance.

Rules and Regulations

Entering and Exhibiting

Please note that rules in specific departments may conflict with the Rules and Regulations section. If a conflict arises, the Show Management reserves the right to determine which rule will supersede.

Rule 1 Competition: Exhibitors are responsible for knowing and complying with all applicable rules and regulations. An exhibitor who violates any part of the rules may be subject to forfeiture of privileges and premiums and to such other penalty as the Executive Committee may order.

All entries and/or exhibitors disqualified may forfeit all premium monies, awards, and proceeds, including all Junior Premium Auction sale proceeds. Disqualified exhibitors as well as the owners and partial owners of disqualified entries ("disqualified individuals") may be subject to subsequent actions by the Executive Committee. These actions may include barring the disqualified individuals, their families, representatives, and/or agents from any further participation in the Livestock Show or entry to American Royal facilities.

Rule 2 Interpretation: The American Royal reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations used to arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, or differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of, or connected with, or incident to, the Show, and the right to amend or add to these rules as its judgment may determine. **The American Royal maintains the final and absolute discretion regarding the use or allocation of forfeited premiums or sale proceeds.**

Rule 3 Entry Information: The entry form will be available on the American Royal website www.americanroyal.com. Be sure to download all information applicable to the show(s) you plan to enter. Incomplete or erroneous entries, or entries that do not contain the correct fees, will be returned to the exhibitor for correction. All fees sent with the entries will be deposited and will not be returned with the entry. A fee of \$10.00 will be charged to re-process a returned entry.

All applications for entry must be made on the current American Royal entry form and in accordance with the accompanying instructions. These forms, with all necessary signatures must be submitted online at www.americanroyal.com (Deadline: September 10th)



Paper Entries by Request ONLY! All paper entries are subject to a \$50.00 processing fee per exhibitor. It is suggested paper entries be sent certified mail with return receipt.

In all cases, the American Royal reserves the right to reject entirely or accept conditionally any entry or application.

NOTE: Registered animals must be entered in the name of the owner of record on the registration certificate. **Incomplete or erroneous entries, or entries that do not contain the correct fees, will not be processed and will be returned.** All entries should be printed or typewritten. Illegible entries will be returned. All fees sent with an entry will be deposited and will not be returned with the entry. Corrected entries may be resubmitted. However, there will be no extensions given. Entries which are resubmitted must pay a \$10.00 fee to re-process.

Rule 4 Entry Deadlines: Entries not received or postmarked by **September 10th** will be considered incomplete without a late processing fee. It is suggested entries be sent certified mail with return receipt.

A \$500.00 super late processing fee per exhibitor will be required.

Entries must be submitted online, mailed, or dropped off at the American Royal office. No faxed entries will be accepted.

Rule 5 Stop Payment: Stop payments issued by exhibitors on their checks after entry deadline (September 10th, 2023) will be due and payable. A fee of \$50.00 will be charged for all returned checks. Anyone with a balance due will not be eligible to enter future shows. **No refunds will be given in the event of disqualification of exhibitors and/or animals.**

Rule 6 Refunds: Requests for refunds must be submitted to the American Royal via email to Livestock@americanroyal.com and are subject to a \$20 cancellation fee. Entry fees including bedding, vehicle pass, grooming chute, fitting stand, and exhibitor badge fees will not be refunded after deadline date (September 10th, 2023). There will be no refunds made on transactions under \$10. The amount to be refunded may not be used as a credit toward a future event.

Rule 7 Ownership of Animals: All **market animals, crossbred gilts, wether dam does, and wether dam ewes** entered for competition must have been owned solely by the junior exhibitor by **August 15th, 2023**. All **breeding heifers and pedigreed gilts** must be owned solely by the exhibitor by **September 10th, 2023**.

Rule 7a DNA: The DNA Validation Envelope order form will be available on the American Royal website: www.americanroyal.com. DNA kits may be purchased for \$10.00 each. All envelopes will be species specific and color-coded. Be sure to download all information applicable to the DNA requirements. Incomplete DNA kits will be returned to the exhibitor for correction. A fee of \$10.00 will be charged to re-process a returned DNA kit. ***By submitting DNA to the American Royal, each exhibitor is acknowledging that they can be disqualified for this year's show & for shows in the future should the DNA come back as a mismatch.***

An identification number (federal 840 tag number **and** ear notches for swine, federal 840 tag number for steers, and USDA scrapie ID for lambs/goats) must be included on the DNA sample envelope. Because scrapie tags can occasionally be lost, it is recommended that exhibitors also tattoo lambs and goats and record the tattoo number on the front of the DNA envelope.

Rule 7b DNA Late Processing Fee:

DNA validation samples submitted to the American Royal are the property of the American Royal. Exhibitors relinquish any claim to said samples.

Rule 7c Transfer of Ownership: Premium Auction buyers assume full ownership of their purchase at the “fall of the hammer”. At this point, exhibitors are prohibited from collecting any samples or portions of the animal unless agreed upon in writing between the buyer and the seller.

The American Royal is neither liable nor responsible for any procedures or agreements undertaken or entered into between buyers and sellers.

Rule 8 Breeding Animal Ownership: For open show breeding animals, registry certificates of ownership or transfer must be produced, if required, showing the exhibitors to be the owner at the time of the show. In addition, individual breed association ownership requirements must be met.

For open and junior show breeding animals, animals registered in more than one breed registry may only be entered in one breed show. Animals showing in both junior and open shows must show in only one breed. In the junior show, heifers must have been owned and recorded in the name of the exhibitor by **September 10th, 2023**. Pedigreed gilts must be owned by the junior exhibitor by **September 10th, 2023**.

Rule 9 Firms and Partnerships: Firms and partnerships are only allowed to enter animals in the Open Shows. Firms entering animals for competition must be in existence at the time the entry is made. Affidavits of the date of creation of firms may be required by the management.

Rule 10 Assignment of Pens and Stalls: The assignment of stalls and pens for livestock and tack will be made by the Superintendents of each department.

Rule 11 Stall Area: Any exhibitor defacing stall areas or any property within the American Royal Complex with nails, screws, paint, or any other substance will be charged an amount sufficient to repair damage. Exhibitors are not allowed to sell merchandise in their stall area. Please contact Macy Evans at (816)231-9800 or email marketplace@americanroyal.com if you are interested in vendor space.

Rule 12 Electric Plug-In Adapters: If an exhibitor needs electricity, electric plug-in adapters will be provided. Only one pigtail can be utilized for every two head of livestock. If this rule is not adhered to, show management has the right to reassign electric plug-in adapters.

Rule 13 Care of Animals: After having properly entered their animals, exhibitors must check-in with the superintendent of the appropriate departments. All owners of property or livestock, or others having same in charge, shall care for, guard, protect and preserve the same. The American Royal does not undertake to do so, and it shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage to said property or the owners thereof. The exhibitor is responsible for the complete security of their own animal until they depart the grounds to their next destination.

Rule 14 Entry Numbers: Each entry will be assigned a number that will correspond with a back number. All group entries are to be confirmed at the show when entries are checked.

Breeding cattle exhibitors will receive these numbers during check-in with their corresponding breed association. Entry numbers/back numbers must be displayed by the showman when the animal is in the show ring.

Market animal and breeding gilt, wether dam doe, and wether dam ewe exhibitors will receive entry numbers and must be displayed on the exhibitor while in the show ring.

Rule 15 Compliance: The American Royal, in cooperation with member shows of the North American Livestock Show and Rodeo Managers Association Rule Infraction Database, reserves the right to refuse entry of anyone who has been banned from any other show.

Rule 15b Acceptance of Entries: In all cases the management reserves the right to accept or reject any entry entirely, partially, or conditionally or to dismiss any entry that would be a discredit to the show. The management may choose to inspect animals or choose to have someone inspect them on their behalf. Upon the recommendation after the review, any animal deemed unworthy or objectionable may be dismissed from the exhibition. ***Exhibitors found in violation of these rules can be added to the RID (Rule Infraction Database) list.***



Rule 16 Exhibitor Age Requirements: All junior exhibitors showing a market animal, wether dam ewe, or wether dam doe must be no younger than 7 years old and no older than 21 years old as of January 1st, 2023. Junior breeding heifer

and breeding gilt exhibitors will follow their respective junior breed association age requirements. All market animals of all species must follow ownership guidelines explained in DNA Validation Rules section. All junior market, junior breeding heifers, and breeding gilt exhibitors must obtain the signature of a parent or legal guardian on the entry form regardless of age. Any open show exhibitors under the age of 21 years old must obtain the signature of a parent or legal guardian on the entry form.

Rule 17 Phone Calls: All phone conversations with American Royal staff or volunteers are informative only and are not to be considered binding in any litigation or entry acceptance.

Rule 18 Animals on Grounds: All animals on the grounds must be entered and are expected to show in their respective division. Only animals officially entered will be allowed on the show grounds.

Rule 19 Sale Animals: All live animals entered in any sale at the American Royal must be properly entered in the respective American Royal show. Sale management must send a complete list of owners/sale animals to the American Royal by **September 10, 2023**.

Rule 20 Substitutions: Any substitutions made, or attempted, in any breeding class through deceit may result in disqualification of all animals and parties involved. Said parties may be subject to subsequent actions by the American Royal.

Rule 20a Breeding Cattle Substitutions: The ability to substitute entries is available in the junior and open breeding cattle show. Substitutions may occur within the same breed only. Substitutions may be made only in the name of the original exhibitor/recorded owner as listed on the entry form and must be the same sex – bulls for bulls and females for females. Substitutions must be made with the current American Royal substitution form. **Forms received that do not include all required signatures & credit card number will not be accepted.** Exhibitors wishing to substitute after September 25th, must obtain the approval of the American Royal Livestock Office before the exhibitor/animal arrives on the grounds.

Breeding Cattle Substitution Fees:

Breeding Cattle Substitutions received by September 25th \$20.00 per head

Breeding Cattle Substitutions received after September 25th \$100.00 per head

Rule 20b Pedigreed Gilt Substitutions: Substitutions may occur in different breeds. Substitutions may be made only in the name of the original exhibitor/recorded owner as listed on the entry form. Substitutions must be made with the current American Royal substitution form. **Forms received that do not include all required signatures & credit card number will not be accepted.** Exhibitors wishing to substitute after September 25th, must obtain the approval of the American Royal Livestock Office before the exhibitor/animal arrives on the grounds.

Pedigreed Gilt Substitution Fees:

Pedigreed Gilt Substitutions received by September 25th \$20.00 per head

Pedigreed Gilt Late Substitution received after September 25th \$100.00 per head

Rule 21 Substitute Showman: Junior exhibitors, in all divisions, must be at the American Royal to show their own animals. A substitute showman will only be allowed for one of the following reasons:

- One exhibitor has two animals in the same class
- The owner/exhibitor's exhibition of one animal conflicts with another animal being exhibited in other species
- Death or other family crisis as approved by American Royal management
- Sickness or physical injury documented by a physician
- A pre-approved 4-H or FFA activity. No other school activity will qualify

Written approval for a substitute showman must be obtained from the Livestock Event Manager. When an exhibitor has more than one animal in the same class, one animal may be exhibited by another youth member without obtaining special permission.

Rule 23 Junior Market Auction:

The American Royal reserves the right to modify or cancel the Junior Premium Livestock Auction when necessary.

Junior market exhibitors with animals qualifying and selling in the Junior Premium Livestock Auction **MUST TAKE THEIR OWN ANIMAL THROUGH THE SALE RING**. Animals designated by the management to be sold in the auction must remain under the exhibitor's care and expense until sold. All participants in the auction warrant that:

- (a) The carcass (es) of their animal(s) complies with the United States Department of Agriculture Wholesome Meat Act and is fit for human consumption;
- (b) The carcass(es) of their animal(s) contain(s) no trace or residue of any show enhancing drug or any other substance not approved for administration to such animal(s);
- (c) The carcass (es) of their animal(s) reveals no evidence of any unethical fitting practices including but not limited to injection sites in marketable areas such as top, rounds, hips, etc.
- (d) There exists no unusual circumstance that would materially diminish the value of such carcass (es). These warranties are absolute guarantees of the quality for the sale animal's carcass without regard to the exhibitor's actual responsibility or fault.

In addition to the terms above, all market animal exhibitors qualifying for the Junior Premium Livestock Auction are required to complete an Animal Husbandry form. **All medications, vaccinations, injections, medical treatments and any foreign substances administered, in any form or manner, from the ownership deadline (Monday, August 15, 2023) through the Junior Premium Livestock Auction must be recorded.** This form will be surrendered prior to the Junior Premium Livestock Auction. The American Royal strongly advises all exhibitors to maintain this form through ownership and bring with them to the American Royal to ensure accuracy in record keeping.

All exhibitors that sell an animal in the Junior Premium Livestock Auction will be required to write their buyer a personalized thank you before premiums will be sent. If an exhibitor does not complete a thank you, premiums will be withheld and participation in future years may be banned.

All market exhibitors are required to complete a Quality Assurance program. Examples include: Youth for the Quality Care of Animals, Quality Counts, Beef Quality Assurance, Pork Quality Assurance, etc. The program name and certificate number will be required on all market entry forms. Exhibitors failing to submit this information will have entries returned as incomplete. The American Royal reserves the right to verify if programming fits the requirements of the show and is acceptable.

All auction animals will be harvested at a processing facility designated by the American Royal management. Sale money may be withheld if the animal is found to have been tampered, altered, or if the carcass is condemned.

Exhibitors found in violation of these rules can be added to the RID (Rule Infraction Database) list.

Rule 23 Erroneous Entry: Exhibitors are responsible for their own errors and those of their agents in filling out entry forms. Animals that have been entered in a wrong class will be transferred to their proper class upon application to management who will determine the matter upon its merit. If such classes have been judged, they will not be reopened.

Rule 24 Fraudulent Ownership: Should any individual enter an animal in a name other than that of a bona fide owner or attempt to perpetrate a fraud by misrepresenting any fact, the entry shall not be allowed to compete for or receive any premiums.

Rule 25 Appearance of Exhibits: Exhibitors of livestock are required to keep the area occupied by them neat and attractive in appearance. The stalls, pens, and exhibition places must be cleaned before 8:00 a.m. each day of the show and all refuse disposed of as the Superintendent of the section may direct.

Rule 26 Grooming Chutes (Cattle): Exhibitors may use grooming chutes. Space will not be guaranteed for grooming chutes. A grooming chute permit is required and available for \$35.00 per chute. Any exhibitor failing to have a grooming chute permit clearly visible will be subject to having chute removed from grounds. Chutes must be kept with exhibitors' cattle and cannot be placed in aisles, cleanout alleys, or fire lanes. Any exhibitor that does not comply promptly if requested by the management to remove the grooming chute is subject to disciplinary action including forfeiture of premiums.

Rule 27 Fitting Stands (Sheep/Goats): Exhibitors may use fitting stands. Space will not be guaranteed for fitting stands and stands must be kept in Upper Exhibition Hall. If space is available, only one fitting stand per exhibitor will be allowed. A fitting stand permit is required and available for \$35.00 per stand. Any exhibitor failing to have a fitting stand permit clearly visible will be subject to having the fitting stand removed from grounds. Any exhibitor that does not comply promptly if requested by the management to remove stand is subject to disciplinary action including forfeiture of premiums.

Rule 28 Dogs: Dogs must be on leashes at all times and are restricted in certain areas.

Rule 29 Judging Contests: An exhibitor, by virtue of his/her entry and presence at the show, is expected to allow his/her animal(s) to be used in 4-H, FFA, or collegiate judging contests.

Rule 30 Signage and Decorations: There is no signage allowed outside your assigned exhibitor space. Decorations, signs, posters, etc., may not be taped, nailed, tacked, or otherwise fastened to ceilings, painted surfaces, columns, glass doors, marble, fabric, walls, etc. Approved tape 3M 9589 (double side adhesive), 3M 471 (single side adhesive) and Gaffers tapes are the only approved products for booth markings and carpet applications within the facility. Applied tapes and any residue must be removed from all surfaces prior to move-out. Paint, shoe polish and unapproved tapes are not allowed to be used in the facility. No drilling of the structure is allowed. Any means of attachment must be non-destructive to the structure. Helium balloons are not allowed inside the facility. Glitter and adhesive-backed decals are not permitted in the facility or on the premises. The American Royal reserves the right to assess competitors for reasonable repair costs resulting from the use of unauthorized signage or decorations.

Rule 31 Refusal to Parade: Shows and parades of livestock are an important educational feature of the American Royal. Notice of time and place of parades will be announced by superintendents. Exhibitors refusing to exhibit their animal when called by the superintendent may forfeit all prizes previously won and may be barred from further participation in the Show and required to remove their stock from the Show grounds immediately. Additional penalties may be imposed. Refusal to parade for reasons that meet the approval of the management are excused.

Rule 32 Photographs: Exhibitors of all Champion or Reserve Champion winners must make their animals available for taking of official photographs. Upon request of the American Royal Livestock Show, exhibitors shall make any other animals exhibited available for photographs. Photographs of any animals or exhibitors taken at the show may be used for promotion of the American Royal without compensation to the exhibitor. All such photographs are to become the property of the American Royal Livestock Show, but exhibitors and other interested parties may order prints from the Official Photographer at their expense.

Only photographers displaying the badge of "Official Photographer" are authorized to take livestock photographs for sale on the show grounds.

Rule 32a Media Purposes: By participating in an American Royal event, you consent to your voice, name, and/or likeness being used, without compensation, in any and all media or any other purposes by the American Royal Association, its affiliates and representatives. You hereby hold harmless and release and forever discharge the American Royal Association from all claims and demands related to the use of these images. If you do not wish to appear in images, please speak with the American Royal communications department prior to the event.

Rule 33 Tie-Outs: NO TYING OUT OF CATTLE IS PERMITTED UNTIL 5:30 PM EACH DAY. Temporary tie-outs are available at no charge on first-come basis. Since most cattle will be on the grounds at the same time, please be considerate of fellow exhibitors and only use the tie-out space needed. The American Royal does not guarantee tie-out space and is not liable for security, accidents, or loss of animals or articles in the tie-out area. Cattle tie-outs are temporary panels and, as such, may not be substantial enough to contain some animals. Exhibitors who elect to tie-out at night do so at their own risk and are responsible for the security of their own animals. **No tents are allowed in tie-outs.**

Rule 34 Arrival and Release of Livestock: Arrival and release times are determined by the management in an effort to make the best use of available space and to provide the best possible show for all in attendance. **Exhibitors are expected to keep their livestock on display until the designated time for release unless permission for early release is granted by the Livestock Event Manager.** Failure to comply with this rule may result in forfeiture of premiums. The stated release time should be considered when a decision to enter is made. If necessary, to allow time for cleanup, exhibitors are expected to remove animals and tack from tie and pen space promptly after release time if asked by management to do so.

Rule 34a Reception of Livestock: An earliest arrival time will be stated for all departments. Livestock coming from other shows with overlapping dates must be granted a late arrival when arranged in advance by emailing the Livestock Event Manager: Livestock@americanroyal.com.

Rule 34b Removal of Exhibits: Release times are listed under Department Headings. All first week animals, tack, and equipment must be removed from the American Royal barns by 7:00 p.m. Monday, October 9th, 2023. All second week Market Steers, Steer Momma's, Market Hogs, Breeding Gilts, Lambs, and Goats along with their tack, and equipment must be removed from the American Royal barns by 11:59 p.m., Saturday, October 14, 2023. All third week animals, tack, and equipment must be removed from the American Royal barns by 11:59 p.m., Sunday, October 23, 2023. **Exhibitors must enter through South Gate A (Livestock Gate) to load and unload. No trailers will be allowed through the gate on Wyoming Street.**

Rule 35 Judges: Judges are requested to be familiar with the rules and regulations of this show, and to especially note those rules bearing on the classes they will judge. Due to unforeseen circumstances substitute judges may be made without notification.

Rule 36 Time of Judging: Judging times can be found in the tentative schedule of events. Exhibitors should ascertain at what time the exhibits entered will be judged. Any exhibit not presented promptly at the scheduled time will be barred from competition in the class called. No complaint or protest on the grounds that the judges overlooked exhibits will be considered.

Due to unforeseeable problems with any mechanical devices, the PA system and class calls over that system must be considered a courtesy. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have his/her animal in the ring at the time of judging.

Rule 37 Conduct of Exhibitors: If an exhibitor, in any way, whether in person or by agent, employee, or independent contractor, interferes with a judge during the exposition or demonstrates disrespect to the judge or the show, the management may exclude such exhibitor from competition and may also withhold from such exhibitor any premiums. While in the show ring, exhibitors are required to be neatly and appropriately dressed when exhibiting livestock.

All exhibitors, parents, agents, employees, and independent contractors are expected to conduct themselves in proper fashion. Any disorderly conduct, theft, loud, profane language, or disturbances of any nature may be cause for disqualification from all American Royal events and shows and banishment from the premises. ***Exhibitors found in violation of these rules can be added to the RID (Rule Infraction Database) list.***

Rule 38 Alcohol: Outside alcohol is prohibited at all times within the American Royal Complex per City lease agreement.

Rule 39 Legal Drinking Age: In Missouri, the legal drinking age is 21. In accordance with this law anyone under 21, in possession of or consuming alcoholic beverages on the American Royal grounds may be reported to the authorities and may be disqualified from all American Royal events, shows, and sales.

Rule 40 Decision of the Judge is Final: The decision of the judge is final in all cases, except where mistake, fraud, misrepresentation, or collusion, not discovered at the time of the award, is proven. In such case, the management or such referee as may be appointed may make the decision; or at its discretion, the case may be appealed to the Executive Committee, from whose decision there can be no appeal.

Rule 41 Code of Ethics: To maintain a high degree of integrity, the American Royal Livestock Show Management reserves the right to disqualify any animals they believe have been fitted in an unethical fashion.

Every exhibitor in consideration of his/her entry being accepted by the American Royal, specifically represents that the exhibitor's animal's natural conformation and structure has not been altered in any way. This alteration is also known as "unethical fitting".

Unethical fitting includes but is not limited to: injection of gas, air, oil, or other foreign substances; cutting/tearing of the hide/underneath the hide or removal of tissue in any attempt to alter the physical appearance of the animal; numbing or "deadening" an animal's tail; cutting tendons of an animal; using foreign substances to build or cosmetically re-shape feet; as well as "twining" which includes the attachment of hair or hair substances (i.e. baling twine, cloth, fiber, etc.).

Any animal found to have surgical alterations other than dehorning, castration, or docking may be disqualified. Unethical fitting also includes attempts to disrupt or change normal dental development. The act of artificially filling animals internally, which includes stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method *per os* (by esophagus) is prohibited for all species.

No injections sites (including sites from acupuncture treatments) may be found in marketable areas such as top, rounds, hips, etc.

The administration of any drug prohibited by Federal, State, or Local law or any drug used in a manner prohibited by Federal, State, or Local law is prohibited. Any entry or substitution made, or attempted, in any breeding or market class through deceit may result in disqualification of all animals and parties involved. Said parties may be subject to subsequent actions by the American Royal. In such cases where unethical fitting, fraud, or misrepresentation appears to have been attempted, the American Royal may appoint veterinarian, official, or committee members to inspect the entry. The American Royal will follow a course of action based upon the findings and conclusions of the examining veterinarian, official, or committee. ***Any exhibitor that is disqualified for any infraction of the rules or code of ethics violations will forfeit all premiums and proceeds. Exhibitors in violation can also be added to the RID (Rules Infraction Database) list.***

Every exhibitor releases the American Royal Association and/or its officers and show officials from all claims or demands arising from subsequent action taken by the American Royal.

Rule 42 Quality Assurance: All market exhibitors are required to complete a Quality Assurance program. Examples include: Youth for the Quality Care of Animals, Quality Counts, Beef Quality Assurance, Pork Quality Assurance, etc. The program name and certificate number will be required on all market entry forms. Exhibitors failing to submit this

information will have entries returned as incomplete. The American Royal reserves the right to verify if programming fits the requirements of the show and is acceptable.

All market animal exhibitors qualifying for the Junior Premium Livestock Auction will be required to complete an Animal Husbandry form. **All medications, vaccinations, injections, medical treatments, and any foreign substances administered, in any form or manner, from the ownership deadline (August 15, 2023) through the Junior Premium Livestock Auction must be recorded.** This form will be surrendered prior to the Junior Premium Livestock Auction. The American Royal strongly advises all exhibitors to maintain this form beginning with ownership and bring with them to the American Royal to ensure accuracy in record keeping. The carcass of the exhibitor's animal shall reveal no evidence of any unethical fitting practices including but not limited to injection sites in marketable areas such as top, rounds, hips, etc.

Rule 43 Drug and Chemical Residue Testing: The American Royal reserves the right to conduct fluid tests, which may include blood and/or urine, and/or tissue tests and/or hair on any animal entered for competition. An exhibitor of an animal producing a positive test result for any unapproved medication or chemical residue may be disqualified and barred from future competition at the American Royal. Any exhibitor whose market animal tests positive for any type of performance enhancing medications, drug, chemical, or substance, including but not limited to steroids, diuretics, anti-inflammatories, tranquilizers, pain killers, or chemical residues may NOT receive payment for that animal and agrees to accept any and all consequences without recourse against the American Royal. ***Exhibitors found in violation of these rules can be added to the RID (Rule Infraction Database) list.***

Rule 43a Ractopamine: According to the Food and Drug Administration, Ractopamine remains an approved feed additive for hogs that are harvested under the USDA. At this time, the American Royal will not test for Ractopamine in market barrows. However, all exhibitors that choose to use Ractopamine will be expected to follow all label instructions.

Rule 44 Animals Disqualified: If an animal awarded a prize is disqualified, lower placing animals will NOT move into higher placing positions.

Rule 45 Paying Awards: Premium money will be mailed to exhibitors and can be expected by January 31, 2024. The American Royal is not responsible for payment of special awards offered by breed associations or individuals. Judges' Books will be used as the only evidence for payment of premiums. Ribbons are not accepted.

The management reserves the right to withhold premiums awarded in any case in which it appears that the rules have not been complied with, or that fraud or deception has been practiced or attempted.

All sale proceeds of the Junior Premium Livestock Auction will be withheld if, after slaughter, the animal is found to have been tampered with or altered or if the carcass is condemned.

Premium monies and/or sale proceeds in any division may be held by the American Royal indefinitely pending drug and other testing or any ongoing investigation or legal action. Funds may be released when all matters are closed.

Rule 46 Scholarships: All scholarships are paid directly to the exhibitor upon proof of enrollment in an institution of higher learning, which may include technical school, community or junior college, university, and graduate or professional school. If the exhibitor chooses not to attend or is unable to attend an institution of higher learning, they must submit a letter to explain the extenuating circumstances.

Scholarships will be paid out to recipients once they have graduated high school. If scholarship funds are not claimed by 25, they will be forfeited to the American Royal Association.

Rule 47 Personal Golf Carts/Scooters: No personal golf carts, gators, or scooters are allowed on the American Royal grounds.

Rule 48 Vendors: If you wish to sell goods or services at the American Royal, you must register as a vendor. Anyone found selling items without the permission of the American Royal or outside of their designated vendor space may be fined an amount two times the cost of a standard booth space and asked to leave the property. For more information on becoming a vendor, please contact Sammy Basler at 816-231-9800 or marketplace@americanroyal.com.

Rule 49 Protests: Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigations. A decision regarding the results of a protest may be withheld until a thorough investigation is completed.

The management will not consider any protests relating to the competence of any judge or the allegation that a judge overlooked an animal. All protests must be in writing, signed, and accompanied by a deposit of \$500.00 cash or certified check, which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. All expenses of proof must be paid by the protesting party. These expenses will not be refunded, regardless of the outcome of the protest. Protests must plainly state the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Livestock Manager within one hour of the occurrence of the incident from which the protest arises. The American Royal will consider protests as speedily as possible and their decision in the matter shall be final.

Rule 50 Liability: The American Royal Association, Inc., and its committees, officers, employees, agents, and representatives are not responsible or liable for any injury, loss, or damage sustained in any way by any exhibitor, employee or independent contractor of an exhibitor, spectator, or any other person or person. The Association is likewise not responsible or liable for damage or injury to any article or animal, or the destruction, injury, or disappearance of such article or animal. Each exhibitor is solely responsible and liable for any loss, injury, or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from any article or animal. Exhibitors agree to protect and indemnify the Association against all claims, legal, or other proceedings and all incidental or related expenses, losses, or damages, as well as damage or injury to any person or property, caused by the exhibitor or his/her employees, independent contractors, or any article or animal.

Rule 51 Health and Safety: Exhibitors and family members are asked to follow all health and safety guidelines. By participating or attending the American Royal, you are acknowledging that an inherent risk of exposure to contagious illnesses exists in any public place where people are present. By attending the American Royal, you and any guests voluntarily assume all risks and agree to not hold the American Royal Association, City of Kansas City, Missouri, County of Jackson; or any of their affiliates, directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, or volunteers liable for any illness or injury.

Rule 52 Weapons: All weapons, concealed or otherwise, are prohibited on the American Royal Complex.

American Royal Livestock Show General Information/Rules and Regulations apply to the Junior Market Division.

Eligibility

The Junior Market Livestock Show is open to youth who are at least 7 years old and no more than 21 years old as of January 1, 2023. The American Royal Association *prefers* that exhibitors are in good standing of a regularly organized 4-H club or members of the FFA. For verification purposes, a state issued form of identification will be used. All market animals of all species must be solely owned by a single exhibitor (not partnership or family farm). See junior breeding heifer division for more information on junior heifers and breeding gilt division for more information on breeding gilts.

Exhibitors may show three market steers, three market goats, three market lambs, and three market barrows in the Junior Market division. All market animals must have DNA submitted. Only animals officially entered will be allowed in the American Royal facility.

DNA Validation Rules

1. **All market steers, market barrows, market lambs, and market goats** entered for competition must have been owned solely by the junior exhibitor by **August 15th, 2023**.

DNA postmarked by **August 15th, 2023** No late processing fee

DNA postmarked between **August 15th-25th** \$50.00 late processing fee per exhibitor

DNA postmarked **August 26th or after**..... Not accepted

***It is highly suggested DNA be sent certified mail with return receipt, to ensure DNA is received in a timely manner. The American Royal has no ability to track envelopes that are not sent certified mail, and in all cases, reserves the right to reject DNA envelopes that do not meet the above deadline. ***

2. **Hair will be used for DNA validation on all species.** Hair collection envelopes must be ordered from the American Royal. **All DNA validation envelopes will be species specific and color-coded (goats-green, lambs- purple, steers- goldenrod, swine-blue).** Hair sample for livestock being shown at the 2023 American Royal must be submitted in the 2023 DNA hair sample envelope. Please follow the instructions for collecting hair samples exactly. Should the original sample not be a valid sample, the animal may be disqualified, and no monies will be paid.
3. There is no limit on the number of DNA samples that an exhibitor may submit.
4. **Animals must be individually identified.** The following forms of identification must be used. **The identification on the animal at the time of turning in weight cards must exactly match the identification on the DNA envelope.**
 - a. Swine (market barrows and crossbred gilts) must be identified by a Federal 840 ID Number and Ear Notches
 - b. Steers must be identified by a Federal 840 ID Tag. No exceptions.
 - c. Lamb and Goat must be identified by a Scrapie ID number*. Entire ID number including state ID and herd number** is required

***Because scrapie tags can occasionally be lost, it is recommended that you also tattoo the lamb or goat and record the tattoo number on the front of the DNA envelope.**

****Scrapie tag numbers vary greatly, however each tag will include a state identified, herd number, and animal number. The scrapie number on the DNA envelope must include the entire ID number as listed above and must exactly match the number on the scrapie tag at check-in.**
5. Any discrepancies at check-in will be the responsibility of the exhibitor and the animal may be disqualified from the show. Should additional DNA testing be allowed (only if approved by Livestock Event Manager and determined

on an individual basis), the cost to the exhibitor will be \$150.00 payable immediately by cash or credit card only. After testing is complete, any exhibitor showing an animal without a matching DNA sample will be subject to consequences determined by the American Royal, including, but not limited to, disqualification of animal, forfeit of all monies, and suspension from showing at the American Royal.

6. **Siblings** (two or more individuals having one common parent) **may submit DNA samples on the same animal** if the siblings are involved in the care and management of the animal. **Names and signatures of each sibling must appear on the DNA envelope when it is submitted.** Siblings may submit DNA samples on the same animal but may not show the same animal. All DNA validation envelopes from the same family should be sent in one large envelope.
7. DNA provides proof of ownership. With the exception of the sibling rule above, market animals can only have DNA submitted by one exhibitor. If multiple DNA samples are received for the same animal by multiple exhibitors, the animal and the exhibitor will be disqualified from the 2023 show.
8. **DNA validation is a prerequisite to market animal, wether dam doe, wether dam ewe & crossbred breeding gilt entry. DNA does not constitute an entry in the 2023 American Royal Livestock Show.** Regular entry procedures must be followed; entry deadline is September 10th, 2023. An exhibitor may enter three market barrows, three market lambs, three market goats, and/or three market steers. Only animals which have an individual 2023 DNA Validation Envelope on file with the American Royal may be entered.
9. Should it be necessary to return your DNA validation envelopes for any reason (lack of signatures, etc.) there will be a \$10.00 re-processing fee.

Note: DNA Validation Envelopes/Samples submitted to the American Royal on all junior market animals, crossbred gilts, wether dam ewes, and wether dam does become the property of the American Royal. Exhibitors relinquish any claim to said envelopes and samples when submitted as proof of ownership. Validation Envelopes/Samples are stored in a secure environment and are destroyed in due time following the show.

Entering Animals

The entry form may be found on the American Royal website, www.americanroyal.com. **All entry forms must be signed by the exhibitor and regardless of age the exhibitor's parent or legal guardian. When submitting online, parent or legal guardian approval (electronic signature) is required.**

Entries not received by **September 10th** will be considered incomplete without a late processing fee.



Paper Entries by Request ONLY! All paper entries are subject to a \$50.00 processing fee per exhibitor. It is suggested paper entries be sent certified mail with return receipt.

Late Processing Fees:

Entries received between **September 11th – September 15th** \$75.00 late processing fee per exhibitor

Entries received after **September 15th** please contact the American Royal Livestock Department regarding eligibility. A \$500.00 super late processing fee per exhibitor will be required.

Entries must be submitted online. Paper entries by request only, must be mailed, emailed, or dropped off at the office. No faxed entries will be accepted.

- Animals must be entered by the junior market exhibitor.
- Premiums for junior market entries will be paid only to the junior market exhibitor.

Any junior market exhibitor that is disqualified for any infraction of the rules or code of ethics violations will forfeit all premiums and auction proceeds.

Dress Code

Exhibitors are to be neatly and appropriately dressed when exhibiting. Exhibitors participating in showmanship will be required to wear an American Royal Livestock Show shirt. These shirts may be picked up upon arrival in the show office.

Health Requirements

Health requirements are located in the General Information Section. All livestock entering this show will be subject to examination by a show or State Veterinarian upon arrival and/or during the show.

Animals with active lesions of ringworm with resulting loss of hair, or multiple warts visible will not be permitted to exhibit. If animals have had ringworm, lesions must be dried and healed with hair growing back in. Any animal, of any species, showing evidence of infectious, contagious, or communicable diseases will be immediately withdrawn from the show, removed from the grounds or held in quarantine at owner's risk and expense. These animals must remain in the quarantine area while on the grounds, failure to cooperate may result in disqualification. There will be no refund of entry or other fees on animals withdrawn.

Weigh Back

The American Royal will be using a weigh back system. A weight card will be obtained when the exhibitor checks in at the Livestock Show Office. The junior market exhibitor must fill out and turn in the weight card at check-in with a called/declared weight. This will become the animal's official weight. All junior market animals will be divided into classes according to weight after processing. All market steers will be weighed before going into the show ring. The top five (or more, at the show's discretion) placing animals in each class for market lamb, goat, and hog classes will be weighed. No reweighs will be allowed once the animal has stepped off of the scale. **New in 2023 market hogs and breeding gilts will have a 15lb weigh back, market lambs and wether dam ewes will have a 7lb weigh back, market goats and wether dam does will have a 5lb weigh back. Market Steers will still have a 5% tolerance.** All animals outside of the weigh back tolerance will be disqualified.

Judging Contest

An exhibitor, by virtue of their entry and presence at the show, is expected to allow their animal(s) to be used in 4-H, FFA, or college judging contests.

Caring for and Showing Animals

Exhibitors must care for their livestock and present them before the judges unassisted. No nose leads allowed when showing market steers.

Junior market exhibitors, in all divisions, must be at the American Royal to show their own animals. A substitute showman will only be allowed for the following reasons:

- Two animals in the same class
- Conflicts with animals being exhibited in other species
- Death or other family crisis
- Sickness or a physical injury documented by a physician
- A pre-approved 4-H or FFA activity. No other school activity will qualify.

Written permission for a substitute showman must be obtained from the Livestock Event Manager. When an exhibitor has more than one animal in the same class, one animal may be exhibited by another youth member without obtaining special permission.

Feed and Bedding

Feed may be purchased from the feed department. Exhibitors must furnish their own feed pans, buckets, and other equipment necessary to care for their animals. Cattle ties and the tie-out area will be bedded with material provided by the American Royal. Exhibitors may purchase bedding from the feed department or bring their own.

Showmanship Contests

Any exhibitor showing in the junior market show may enter the respective showmanship contest. There will be separate contests for beef, swine, goats, and lambs. Breeding gilts will show with market barrows. The entry fee is \$10.00 per contest if included on entry form. Exhibitors may enter at the time of arrival for a fee of \$30.00 per contest. Contests will be divided into classes by exhibitor age. Exhibitors must use their own animal that is properly entered in the 2023 American Royal Livestock Show. They may not bring an animal exclusively for the showmanship contest. Fitting is optional in the beef showmanship contests.

Exhibitors participating in showmanship will be required to wear an American Royal Livestock Show shirt. These shirts may be picked up upon arrival or in the show office.

There will be three age divisions of Showmanship for market animal exhibitors: (based on exhibitor's age on 1/1/23):

- 7-12 years old (Junior)
- 13-16 years old (Intermediate)
- 17 years & older (Senior)

Rosettes will be presented to age-division winners and awards will be presented to the Overall Champion and Reserve Champion in each species. In addition, the BOTAR Organization will award \$150 to the Champion Showman in each species.

A limited number of VIP passes will be available for purchase for \$100 each. This VIP pass authorizes exhibitors to park 1 vehicle in parking Lot A, located on the South side of the Livestock barns. No campers or trailers are allowed with this pass.

**** Entry gates will be monitored. Please wear your exhibitor badge or have it readily available at all times. There will be a \$10.00 per entry charge for parking (without a pass) and a \$5.00 per entry grounds admission for each person without a badge. (NO grounds admission will be charged for children 5 years old and under).**

Badges and vehicle passes may be ordered on entry forms and picked up upon arrival. Badges and passes will **NOT** be mailed. They may also be purchased between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. at the Livestock Office.

United States Department of Agriculture Wholesome Meat Act

The United States Department of Agriculture Wholesome Meat Act applies to the sale of market livestock sold during the American Royal Livestock Show as follows:

- a) Animals must be in good health and carcasses free of drug or chemical residue.
- b) Antibiotics and sulfonamides have required withdrawal periods.
- c) Drug label directions for use and withdrawal periods must be followed.
- d) If drug or other chemical residues are found in tissue of carcasses, the entire carcass may be condemned. If drug or other chemical residues are found in tissue of carcasses of animals sold through the sale or sales connected with the American Royal Livestock Show, said show will in no way be liable or responsible for conditions of carcass or sale price of animal. Exhibitor forfeits all right to sale price. Before administering antibiotics and/or sulfonamides, consult a licensed practicing veterinarian, or label directions of the drug.

Wholesome Assurance Statement

The use by non-veterinarians* of animal drugs or other substances in any manner other than in accord with the labeling approved by FDA is a violation of federal law.

***Note:** Abuse of the extra-label privilege by veterinarians is unethical and is subject to serious consequences such as license revocation.

Any food animal must not exceed FDA/EPA/USDA established tolerances for any foreign substance including drugs, pesticides, feed additives, or other chemicals.

Results of residue testing are subject to investigation by USDA and FDA prosecution.

Any misrepresentation of food animal that can potentially affect the acceptability of the carcass or milk will be considered fraud.

Inspection

All animals of all species in the Junior Market Division are governed by the rules and regulations of the American Royal Livestock Show and are subject to visual, physical, and biological screening and inspection by the American Royal

Veterinarian and Show Officials. Any violation of the code of ethics, animal abuse, fraud or misrepresentation will be dealt with on an individual basis. Any market or breeding animal exhibitor that is disqualified for any infraction of the rules or code of ethics violations will forfeit all premiums and proceeds. Every exhibitor, by entering an animal for exhibition, agrees to submit the entry for inspection if requested; exhibitor then releases the American Royal Association and/or its officers or show officials from all claims or demands arising from subsequent action taken by the Executive Committee.

2023 Junior Market Auction

The 2023 Junior Premium Livestock Auction will be held at the American Royal Complex and feature market steers, market lambs, goats, and hogs. This is a terminal auction.

Junior Premium Livestock Auction

A Junior Market Livestock Auction for selected steers, market lambs, goats, and barrows is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, October 14, 2023. Additional information will be posted on the American Royal website when available. Junior market exhibitors, with animals qualifying and selling in the Junior Premium Livestock Auction (steer, lamb, goat, and/or barrow), are required to **TAKE THEIR OWN ANIMAL(S) THROUGH THE SALE RING**.

Animals designated by the Management to be sold in the auction must remain under the exhibitor's care and expense until the animal is sold. **All animals included in the Junior Premium Livestock Auction will be moved to a designated holding area and will remain there, under the exhibitor's care, until sale time.** Animals must be presented at the sale in their natural state. Decoration of sale animals is prohibited. Exhibitors included in the Junior Premium Livestock Auction may be required to take a photo with their buyers at the designated photo area once their animal has sold. Failure to do so will result in forfeited premiums.

All exhibitors that sell an animal in the Junior Auction will be required to write their buyer a personalized thank you before premiums will be sent. If an exhibitor does not send a thank you, premiums will be withheld and participation in future years may be banned.

If the carcass of any animal, regardless of being sold through the Junior Premium Livestock Auction, or sold directly to a packing plant, is condemned for any reason, the exhibitor will receive no payment. If prohibited substances are found in blood, urine, hair, tissue, hide or carcasses of animals at time of testing or following slaughter or if there is any evidence of unethical fitting, and/or tampering, the exhibitor will be subject to all sanctions, including but not limited to, disqualification, forfeiture of all premiums and proceeds, and barred from future participation in the American Royal Livestock Show.

The American Royal Management reserves the right to cancel or change scheduling or events when necessary.

Auction Sale Price*:

80% of the sale price will go to the exhibitor, 20% will go to the American Royal up to price levels stated below. Once the sale price exceeds the below price, the exhibitor will receive 50% and the American Royal will receive 50%.

Of what goes to the American Royal, 12.5% of proceeds from Market Steers will go to the Stanley Stout Memorial Scholarship Fund to support scholarships for the Supreme Heifer Drive. Another 12.5% of proceeds from Market Lambs, Goats and Barrows will go to support scholarships for the Wether Dam Ewe, Wether Dam Doe and Breeding Gilt Drive. The remainder will support the American Royal Association mission-focused events.

Price Levels

Market Steers- \$35,000

Market Lambs, Goats, and Barrows- \$10,000

Distribution of Funds

Exhibitors with a sale price less than \$10,000 will receive a 100% payout of proceeds due. This check will be sent to the exhibitor via mail no later than January 31, 2024.

Exhibitors with a sale price of \$10,000 or more will receive an 80% payout of proceeds due. This check will be sent to the exhibitor via mail no later than January 31, 2024. The remaining 20% of the amount due to the exhibitor will be held by the American Royal as a scholarship for the exhibitor.

The scholarship will be paid directly to the exhibitor upon proof of enrollment in an institution of higher learning which may include technical school, community or junior college, university, and graduate or professional school.¹ If the exhibitor chooses not to attend an institution of higher learning, they must submit a letter to explain the extenuating circumstances.

¹ The American Royal reserves the right, in the event of extenuating circumstances, to provide held scholarship funds to exhibitors before enrollment in a qualifying institution of higher learning or in the event the exhibitor does not attend an institution of higher learning as outlined above. The determination of what constitutes “extenuating circumstances” shall be wholly at the discretion of the American Royal.

Market Goat Rules

1. All General Rules and Regulations of the American Royal apply.
2. An exhibitor may show three market goats.
3. Absolutely no extra or alternate goats (goats not entered in the show) will be allowed on the grounds.
4. Ownership deadline is August 15th, 2023 and DNA Validation Samples must be on file with the American Royal on or before that deadline.
5. DNA Validation Samples must be on file by August 15th, 2023 for all goats. Scrapie ID at weigh-in must match exactly the Scrapie ID that was submitted on the DNA sample envelope. Because Scrapie Tags can occasionally be lost, it is recommended that you also tattoo the goat and record that tattoo number on the front of the DNA envelope along with the Scrapie ID number. For more DNA information, see the DNA Validation Rules under the Junior Market Division.
6. Stalling will be assigned at check-in. No tack pens allowed until after arrival deadline except those assigned by the Superintendent. Pens are strictly on a first come, first serve basis, due to limited space, no exhibitor will be allowed to reserve pens.
7. Once moved-in goats may not leave the barn until released. Goats may be exercised in the barn or show ring if available.
8. Muzzles or similar devices will be allowed on goats.
9. Electric clippers will be allowed in the goat barn. Hand shears may be used. All Market Goats must have all hair above the knees and hocks slick shorn within 1/4 inch PRIOR to arrival at the show for veterinary inspection purposes.
10. No cots or other sleeping accommodations will be allowed in the barn.
11. All goats must have an official health certificate issued by an accredited veterinarian in the state of origin.
12. Any Exhibitor caught using unethical fitting practices will have all premiums held and could result in disqualification. Unethical fitting includes but is not limited to: injection of gas, air, oil, or other foreign substances under the skin; cutting/tearing of the hide/underneath the hide or removal of tissue in any attempt to alter the physical appearance of the animal; numbing or “deadening” an animal’s tail; cutting tendons of an animal; using foreign substances to build or cosmetically re-shape feet; as well as “twining” which includes the attachment of

hair or hair substances (i.e. baling twine, cloth, fiber, etc.). Please read the Code of Ethics in the Rules and Regulations Section for more information.

13. Wethers having one (1) or both testicles contained in body cavity are ineligible to show.
14. Market goat classes are open to wethers only.
15. The American Royal will be using a weigh back system. A weight card will be obtained when the exhibitor picks up their exhibitor packet. The junior market goat exhibitor must fill out and turn in the weight card at check-in with a called/declared weight. This will become the animal's official weight. All junior market goats will be divided into classes according to weight after check-in. No reweighs will be allowed once the animal has stepped off the scale. There will be a **5lb** tolerance from the declared weight and all animals outside of the **5lb** tolerance will be disqualified. Five (5) or more in each class for market goats will be weighed. The minimum weight for exhibition of a market goat at the American Royal is 50 pounds and there is no maximum weight. Market goats not meeting the minimum requirements will not be allowed to show.
16. If horned, market goats must have horns tipped blunt. Tipping or removal of horns is not allowed on the grounds and will result in disqualification.
17. Goats must be broke to lead. Exhibitors may use halters, collars, or a collar with a short lead when showing.
18. An exhibitor, by virtue of their entry and presence at the show, is expected to allow their animal(s) to be used in 4-H, FFA, or college judging contests if selected by breed association or the American Royal staff.
19. Exhibitors are responsible for keeping pens clean and will provide their own bedding materials, feed and water. Feed and bedding are available on the grounds in the Feed Room. Exhibitors will be allowed to bring their own feed on the grounds in limited amounts on a daily basis.



Health Requirements

Health requirements are located in the General Information Section.

Fitting Stands

A Fitting Stand Permit is available for \$35.00/stand. Limit one stand per exhibitor. Any exhibitor failing to have a Fitting Stand Permit clearly visible will be subject to having the stand removed from the grounds. Any exhibitor who does not comply promptly if requested by the management to remove a stand is subject to disciplinary action including forfeiture of premiums.

Classes

Market goats are required to weigh a minimum of 50 pounds to be eligible to show. All goats will be divided by weight into classes at the discretion of the superintendent and the American Royal Livestock Event Manager. There will be four weight divisions. The four division Champions and reserve champions (eight head) will compete for Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Market Goat. Classes in the weight divisions will be established after weight cards are turned in and a list of classes will be posted on Thursday afternoon, October 12th, 2023.

Champion and Reserve in each division of market goats will qualify for the Junior Premium Livestock Auction and **must sell** through the auction. Market goat exhibitors that do not participate in division/Grand Champion selection, and/or do not participate in the auction, will be immediately disqualified, and will forfeit all premiums and awards for the 2023 show. They will also go before the American Royal Livestock Review Board and may be disqualified from participating in future American Royal shows and/or events. Exhibitors who violate this rule may be added to the RID list (Rule Infraction Database).

All goats included in the Junior Premium Livestock Auction will be moved to a designated holding area and will remain there, under the exhibitor's care, until sale time.

THIS IS A TERMINAL AUCTION. All sale goats will be harvested at a processing facility designated by the American Royal management. All carcasses will be subject to inspection and drug testing by the authorities.

Junior market exhibitors are expected to be at the auction to take their animal through the sale ring. Any exhibitor failing to take their required goat through the auction will forfeit all premium money and will be barred from entering future American Royal Show. Exhibitors must leave a halter on all sale goats after the sale. The sale will be handled by the American Royal. A portion of each sale will be set aside in a fund and used for operational and educational purposes.

All exhibitors that sell an animal in the Junior Auction will be required to write their buyer a personalized thank you before premiums will be sent. If an exhibitor does not send a thank you, premiums will be withheld and participation in future years may be banned.

The Show Management reserves the right to interpret the rules or make any decision regarding the show and sale deemed necessary in the best interest of the show.

2. An exhibitor may show three market lambs.
3. Classification Guidelines -
2023 American Royal Market Lamb Show will be classified into 2 Divisions: White Face-Influenced market lambs (i.e. Dorset, Southdown, Dorper, etc., and crosses using white face breeds i.e. speckle face) and Black Face market lambs. The decision of the classifier is final.
4. Absolutely no extra or alternate lambs (lambs not entered in the show) will be allowed on the grounds.
5. Ownership deadline is August 15th, 2023 and DNA Validation Samples must be on file with the American Royal on or before that deadline.
6. DNA Validation Samples must be on file by August 15th, 2023 for all lambs. Scrapie ID at weigh-in must match exactly the Scrapie ID that was submitted on the DNA sample envelope. Because Scrapie Tags can occasionally be lost, it is recommended that you also tattoo the lamb and record that tattoo number on the front of the DNA envelope along with the Scrapie ID number. For more DNA information, see the DNA Validation Rules under the Junior Market Division.
7. Stalling will be assigned at check-in. No tack pens allowed until after arrival deadline except those assigned by the Superintendent. Pens are strictly on a first come, first serve basis, due to limited space, no exhibitor will be allowed to reserve pens.
8. Once moved-in, lambs may not leave the barn until released. Lambs may be exercised in the barn or show ring if available.
9. Muzzles or similar devices will be allowed on lambs.
10. Electric clippers will be allowed in the lamb barn. Hand shears may be used. All market lambs must be completely slick shorn within ¼ inch PRIOR to arrival at the show for inspection purposes. Wool may be left on the legs only below the knees and hocks. The only exception will be those animals competing in the fitting contest.



11. No cots or other sleeping accommodations will be allowed in the barn.
12. All market lambs must have an official health certificate issued by an accredited veterinarian in the state of origin.
13. Any exhibitor caught using unethical fitting practices will have all premiums held and could result in disqualification. Unethical fitting includes but is not limited to: injection of gas, air, oil, or other foreign substances; cutting/tearing of the hide/underneath the hide or removal of tissue in any attempt to alter the physical appearance of the animal; numbing or “deadening” an animal’s tail; cutting tendons of an animal; using foreign substances to build or cosmetically re-shape feet; as well as “twining” which includes the attachment of hair or hair substances (i.e. baling twine, cloth, fiber, etc.). Please read the Code of Ethics in the Rules and Regulations Section for more information.
14. Wethers having one (1) or both testicles contained in body cavity are ineligible to show.
15. Market lamb classes are open to wether lambs only.
16.  The American Royal will be using a weigh back system. A weight card will be obtained when the exhibitor picks up their exhibitor packet. The junior market lamb exhibitor must fill out and turn in the weight card at check-in with a called/declared weight. This will become the animal’s official weight. All junior market lambs will be divided into classes according to weight after check-in. No reweighs will be allowed once the animal has stepped off the scale. There will be a **7lb** tolerance from the declared weight and all animals outside of the **7lb** tolerance will be disqualified. Five (5) or more in each class for market lambs will be weighed. The minimum weight for exhibition of a market lamb at the American Royal is 100 pounds and there is no maximum weight. Market lambs not meeting the minimum requirements will not be allowed to show.
17. An exhibitor, by virtue of their entry and presence at the show, is expected to allow their animal(s) to be used in 4-H, FFA, or college judging contests if selected by breed association or the American Royal staff.
18. Exhibitors are responsible for keeping pens clean and will provide their own bedding materials, feed and water. Feed and bedding is available on the grounds in the Feed Room. Exhibitors will be allowed to bring their own feed on the grounds in limited amounts on a daily basis.

Fitting Stands

A Fitting Stand Permit is available for \$35.00/stand. Limit one per exhibitor. Any exhibitor failing to have a Fitting Stand Permit clearly visible will be subject to having the stand removed from the grounds. Any exhibitor who does not comply promptly if requested by the management to remove a stand is subject to disciplinary action including forfeiture of premiums.

Classes

 White Face-Influenced market Lambs are required to weigh a minimum of 100 pounds to be eligible to show. All lambs will be weighed and divided by weight into classes at the discretion of the superintendent and the American Royal Livestock Event Manager. The Division Champion and Reserve Champion will compete for Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Market Lamb. The Division Champion will automatically qualify for the Junior Premium Livestock Auction. If 25 or more head of White Face-Influenced market lambs exhibit, then the Reserve Division Champion will qualify for the Junior Premium Livestock Auction in 2024.

Black Face market lambs are required to weigh a minimum of 100 pounds to be eligible to show. All lambs will be weighed and divided by weight into classes at the discretion of the superintendent and the American Royal Livestock Event Manager. Black Face market lambs will be divided into 5 divisions. The division Champions and Reserve Champions (minimum ten head) will compete for Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Market Lamb. Classes in the weight divisions will be established after weigh-in and a list of classes will be posted on Thursday afternoon, October 12th, 2023.

Market Barrow Rules

1. All General Rules and Regulations of the American Royal apply.
2. An exhibitor may show three market barrows.
3. Absolutely no extra or alternate market barrows (market barrows not entered in the show) will be allowed on the grounds.
4. Ownership deadline for market barrows is August 15th, 2023 and DNA Validation Samples must be on file with the American Royal on or before that deadline.
5. DNA Validation Samples must be on file by August 15th, 2023 for all market barrows. Market barrows Federal 840 ID number and ear notches must match exactly the Federal 840 ID number and ear notches that was submitted on the DNA envelope. For more DNA information, see the DNA Validation Rules under the Junior Market Division.
6. **Market barrows will be penned by arrival.** Mandatory 2 pigs per pen. Dividers are encouraged. No tack pens. Pens are strictly on a first-come, first-serve basis. Due to limited space, no exhibitor will be allowed to reserve pens except special circumstances with permission from show management.
7. Once moved-in market barrows may not leave the barn. Barrows will be released following the Market Barrow Show. Market barrows may be exercised in the barn or show arena if available.
8. No cots or other sleeping accommodations will be allowed in the barn.
9. All market barrows must have an official health certificate issued by an accredited veterinarian in the state of origin.



10. The American Royal will be using a weigh back system. A weight card will be obtained when the exhibitor picks up their exhibitor packet. The junior market hog exhibitor must fill out and turn in the weight card at check-in with a called/declared weight. This will become the animal's official weight. All junior market barrows will be divided into classes according to weight after check-in. No reweighs will be allowed once the animal has stepped off the scale. There will be a **15lb** tolerance from the declared weight and all animals outside of the **15lb** tolerance will be disqualified. Five (5) or more in each class for market barrows will be weighed. The minimum weight for exhibition of a market hog at the American Royal is **230** pounds and maximum weight is **300** pounds. Market barrows not meeting the minimum requirements will not be allowed to show.
11. **Market barrows will be released following the show.** It is a non-terminal market hog show (except for those animals sold through the Junior Premium Livestock Auction).
12. Shakers, downers, and any other unfit hogs will not be allowed to show.
13. Breed and crossbred divisions will be broken into classes at the discretion of the superintendent and the American Royal Livestock Event Manager.
14. The act of artificially filling animals internally, which includes stomach pumping, drench tubes, bottles, syringes, suckle bottles, or any other method per os (by esophagus) is prohibited on the American Royal grounds.
15. All clipping and/or shearing of hogs is prohibited on the grounds of the American Royal. No hogs may be restrained on the grounds of the American Royal by snare, wire, rope, or other means unless under the supervision and/or direction of the show office or the official veterinarian.
16. An exhibitor, by virtue of their entry and presence at the show, is expected to allow their animal(s) to be used in 4-H, FFA, or college judging contests.
17. Exhibitors are responsible for keeping pens clean and will provide their own feed and water. Feed and bedding is available on the grounds in the Feed Room. Exhibitors will be allowed to bring their own feed on the grounds in limited amounts on a daily basis.

National Junior Swine Association and Team Purebred Market Barrows

Purebred market hog classes will be established as numbers warrant for registered Berkshire, Chester, Duroc, Hampshire, Hereford/Tamworth, Landrace, Poland, Spotted and Yorkshire. At least 10 hogs of a breed must be checked-in at the show for a breed division. If fewer than 10 hogs of a particular breed are checked-in they will show in an Other Registered Purebred Division. No registered hogs of the aforementioned 9 breeds will show in the Crossbred Division. The above purebred classes are sponsored by their respective breed associations. There will be no other breed classes.

National Junior Swine Association Special Rules

Breed classes will be provided for purebred Berkshire, Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace, and Yorkshire, market barrows. If fewer than 10 hogs of a breed are checked-in they will show in an Other Registered Purebreds Division. No registered pig of the aforementioned 5 breeds will show in the Crossbred Division. These five breeds must meet the following requirements:

1. Entries may be purchased market barrows, but must be owned by the junior exhibitor, the exhibitor's family name or exhibitor's farm name by August 15th, 2023.
2. Market barrows must be registered in the junior exhibitor's name, exhibitor's family name, or exhibitor's farm name.
3. All animals are to be guaranteed negative of the stress gene to be exhibited at a NSR or NJSA event.
4. All Berkshire, barrows must be stress negative and the stress status must be on the pedigree (HAL – 1843* nm must be under the pig's name on the pedigree).
5. NSR and NJSA reserve the right to randomly collect a DNA profile on exhibited animals for stress gene, parentage verification, and breed purity at any event where registered animals are exhibited. This collection will be supervised by NSR or NJSA representatives.
6. All Breed Champions, Reserve Champion and/or any randomly selected market barrows may be blood tested for presence of the stress gene, parentage verification, and breed purity as DNA technology becomes available.
7. Champion and Reserve Champion overall premiums as well as Breed Champion and Reserve Breed Champion premiums will not be awarded until the DNA results are verified at the NSR office.
8. Any market barrows that fail these DNA tests for the stress gene, parentage verification or breed purity will forfeit all premiums and awards. Showmanship standings, however, will not be affected by failed test results. If premiums and awards are not returned to NSR, the exhibitor will not be allowed to compete in future NJSA or NSR events.
9. Any hog disqualified by NJSA will also be disqualified by the American Royal and all monies will be withheld.

Team Purebred Special Rules

Breed classes will be provided for purebred Chester, Hereford/Tamworth, Poland, and Spotted market barrows. If fewer than 10 hogs of a breed are checked-in, they will show in an Other Registered Purebreds Division. No registered pig of the aforementioned 5 breeds will show in the Crossbred Division. These 5 breeds must meet the following requirements:

1. Entries may be purchased market barrows, but must be owned by the junior exhibitor, the exhibitor's family name or exhibitor's farm name by August 15th, 2023.
2. Market barrows must be registered in the junior exhibitor's name, exhibitor's family name, or exhibitor's farm name.
3. All Chester White hogs must be guaranteed to be stress negative.
4. Market barrows must meet all registration eligibility requirements of their respective breed association. Team Purebred field staff or qualified representatives will check papers and inspect all market barrows for breed eligibility.
5. Any hog disqualified by Team Purebred, for any reason, will also be disqualified by the American Royal and all monies will be withheld.

Crossbred and Other Market barrows

Any pig that does not qualify for the National Swine Registry and Team Purebred registered classes will show in this division.

Junior Premium Livestock Auction

PLEASE NOTE: THIS SECTION IS UNDER REVIEW BY THE AMERICAN ROYAL LEADERSHIP. ANY CHANGES WILL BE ANNOUNED & POSTED BY SEPTEMBER 1ST.

There must be 10 barrows in a breed to allow both the Grand and Reserve Champion within a breed to sale. Sale slots then will be based off of numbers within breeds and crossbreeds and extra sale slots will go to those breeds with the largest participation. A maximum of 23 market barrows will be selected for the Junior Premium Livestock Auction,

including the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Market Hog. Sale order will be made by the swine superintendent and the judge. Breeds will be alternated.

All market barrows included in the Junior Premium Livestock Auction will be moved to a designated holding area and will remain there, under the exhibitor's care, until sale time.

Market barrows will be sold by the head, not by weight.

THIS IS A TERMINAL AUCTION. All sale market barrows will be harvested at a processing facility designated by the American Royal management. All carcasses will be subject to inspection and drug testing by the authorities.

Junior market exhibitors are expected to be at the auction to take their animal through the sale ring. Any exhibitor failing to take their required market hog through the auction will forfeit all premium money and will be barred from entering future American Royal Show. The sale will be handled by the American Royal. A portion of each sale will be set aside in a fund and used for operational and educational purposes.

All exhibitors that sell an animal in the Junior Auction will be required to write their buyer a personalized thank you before premiums will be sent. If an exhibitor does not send a thank you, premiums will be withheld and participation in future years may be banned.

The show management reserve the right to interpret the rules or make any decision regarding the show and sale deemed necessary in the best interest of the show.

American Royal Livestock Show General Information/Rules and Regulations apply to the Junior Breeding Division.

Only animals officially entered will be allowed on the show grounds.

Junior Breeding Division Rules

1. The junior breeding heifer and breeding gilt shows are open to any exhibitor who is in good standings with their junior breed association.
2. The junior breeding heifer and breeding gilt show will follow those junior breed associations' age requirements. See the corresponding breed section for specific age requirements.
3. For junior breeding heifers to be eligible for open cattle show competition, exhibitors must comply with open cattle show regulations including guidelines for entry, arrival, and release.
4. Junior breeding heifers and purebred breeding gilts must be registered solely in the junior member's name on or before September 10th, 2023. Animals registered in a family name or two or more junior's names are not eligible to show in the junior show. This applies even if an animal is registered in a farm or ranch name and the junior member is the only person listed on that membership. Bred and owned animals must be owed solely by a junior member on or before September 10th, 2023. Be sure to check individual breed rules for any exceptions.
5. Original registration certificate must be presented for inspection.
6. Junior breeding heifers and breeding gilts must be purebred unless otherwise specified.
7. Animals entered in a junior breeding division must meet the respectable breed association's requirements.
8. Officials from each breed association will check tattoos on junior breeding heifers and ear notches on breeding gilts, registration papers, and will distribute entry numbers at check-in.
9. Show management reserves the right to break large classes if deemed necessary, in which case the monies may be split.
10. Cattle recorded in more than one breed registry may only show in one breed show. An animal entered for both the junior and open breeding shows, must show in the same breed.
11. Exhibitors of the champion junior heifer of their respective breed are expected to show in the Supreme Heifer Drive unless otherwise stated in breed rules. Any exhibitor choosing not to compete as the breed champion will not receive a scholarship and that breed will not be represented in the Supreme Champion line-up. Exhibitors of these champions should be present to show their own animal(s) unless prior permission is given by show management.
12. Exhibitors of the champion Breeding Gilts of their respective breed are expected to show in the Supreme Breeding Gilt Drive unless otherwise stated in breed rules. Exhibitors of these champions should be present to show their own animal(s) unless prior permission is given by show management.

Crossbred Breeding Gilts, Wether Dam Ewes, Wether Dam Does

DNA Validation Rules

1. **All crossbred gilts, wether dam ewes, and wether dam does** entered for competition must have been owned solely by the junior exhibitor by **August 15th, 2023**.

DNA postmarked by **August 15th, 2023** No late processing fee

DNA postmarked between **August 15th-25th** \$50.00 late processing fee per exhibitor

DNA postmarked **August 26th or after**..... Not accepted

***It is highly suggested DNA be sent certified mail with return receipt, to ensure DNA is received in a timely manner. The American Royal has no ability to track envelopes that are not sent certified mail, and in all cases, reserves the right to reject DNA envelopes that do not meet the above deadline. ***

2. **Hair will be used for DNA validation on all species.** Hair collection envelopes must be ordered from the American Royal. **All DNA validation envelopes will be species specific and color-coded (goats-green, lambs- purple, steers- goldenrod, swine-blue).** DNA hair sample for livestock being shown at the 2023 American Royal must be submitted in the 2023 DNA hair sample envelope. Please follow the instructions for collecting hair samples exactly. Should the original sample not be a valid sample, the animal may be disqualified, and no monies will be paid.
3. There is no limit on the number of DNA samples that an exhibitor may submit.
4. **Animals must be individually identified.** The following forms of identification must be used. **The identification on the animal at the time of turning in entry forms must exactly match the identification on the DNA envelope.**
 - a. Crossbred gilts must be identified by a Federal 840 ID Number **and** Ear Notches
 - b. Wether dam ewes and wether dam does must be identified by a Scrapie ID number*. Entire ID number including state ID and herd number** is required

**Because scrapie tags can occasionally be lost, it is recommended that you also tattoo the wether dam ewe or wether dam doe and record the tattoo number on the front of the DNA envelope.*

***Scrapie tag numbers vary greatly, however each tag will include a state identified, herd number, and animal number. The scrapie number on the DNA envelope must include the entire ID number as listed above and must exactly match the number on the scrapie tag at check-in.*

5. Any discrepancies at weigh-in or check-in will be the responsibility of the exhibitor and the animal may be disqualified from the show. Should additional DNA testing be allowed (only if approved by Livestock Event Manager and determined on an individual basis), the cost to the exhibitor will be \$150.00 payable immediately by cash or credit card only. After testing is complete, any exhibitor showing an animal without a matching DNA sample will be subject to consequences determined by the American Royal, including, but not limited to, disqualification of animal, forfeit of all monies, and suspension from showing at the American Royal.
6. **Siblings** (two or more individuals having one common parent) **may submit DNA samples on the same animal** if the siblings are involved in the care and management of the animal. **Names and signatures of each sibling must appear on the DNA envelope when it is submitted.** Siblings may submit DNA samples on the same animal but may not enter the same animal in the show. All DNA validation envelopes from the same family should be sent in one large envelope.
7. DNA provides proof of ownership. With the exception of the sibling rule above, market animals, crossbred gilts, wether dam ewes, and wether dam does can only have DNA submitted by one exhibitor. If multiple DNA samples

are received for the same animal by multiple exhibitors, the animal and the exhibitor will be disqualified from the 2023 show.

8. **DNA validation is a prerequisite to entry. DNA validation does not constitute an entry in the 2023 American Royal Livestock Show.** Regular entry procedures must be followed; entry deadline is September 10th, 2023. An exhibitor may enter three breeding gilts, three wether dam ewes, and three wether dam does. Only animals which have an individual 2023 DNA Validation Envelope on file with the American Royal may be entered.
9. Should it be necessary to return your DNA validation envelopes for any reason (lack of signatures, etc.) there will be a \$10.00 re-processing fee.

Note: DNA Validation Envelopes/Samples submitted to the American Royal on all junior market animals, crossbred gilts, wether dam ewes, and wether dam does become the property of the American Royal. Exhibitors relinquish any claim to said envelopes and samples when submitted as proof of ownership. Validation Envelopes/Samples are stored in a secure environment and are destroyed in due time following the show.

Entering Animals



Paper Entries by Request ONLY! All paper entries are subject to a \$50.00 processing fee per exhibitor. It is suggested paper entries be sent certified mail with return receipt.

Entry forms along with proper entry fees must be **postmarked, or submitted online, on or before September 10th, 2023.** Late entries must be **postmarked or submitted on or before September 15th, 2023** with a **\$75.00 late fee per exhibitor.**

The electronic entry form may be found on the American Royal website, www.americanroyal.com. **All entry forms must be signed by the exhibitor and regardless of age the exhibitor's parent or legal guardian. When submitting online, parent or legal guardian approval (electronic signature) is required.**

Animals must be entered by the junior breeding exhibitor. Premiums for junior breeding entries will be paid only to the junior breeding exhibitor.

Any junior breeding exhibitor that is disqualified for any infraction of the rules or code of ethics violations will forfeit all premiums.

Dress Code

Exhibitors participating in showmanship will be required to wear an American Royal Livestock Show shirt. These shirts may be picked up upon arrival. Junior breeding exhibitors are to be neatly and appropriately dressed when exhibiting.

Health Requirements

Health requirements are located in the General Information Section. All livestock entering this show will be subject to examination by a show or State Veterinarian upon arrival or during the show.

Animals with active lesions of ringworm with resulting loss of hair, or multiple warts visible will not be permitted to exhibit. If animals have had ringworm, lesions must be dried and healed with hair growing back in. Any animal, of any species, showing evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases will be immediately withdrawn from the show, removed from the grounds or held in quarantine at owner's risk and expense. These animals must remain in the quarantine area while on the grounds, failure to cooperate may result in disqualification. There will be no refund of entry or other fees on animals withdrawn.

Judging Contest

An exhibitor, by virtue of their entry and presence at the show, is expected to allow their animal(s) to be used in 4-H, FFA, or college judging contests.

Caring for and Showing Animals

Exhibitors must care for their livestock and present them before the judges unassisted.

Junior Breeding Exhibitors, in all divisions, must be at the American Royal to show their own animals. A substitute showman will only be allowed for the following reasons:

- Two animals in the same class
- Conflicts with animals being exhibited in other species
- Death or other family crisis
- Sickness or a physical injury documented by a physician
- A pre-approved 4-H or FFA activity. No other school activity will qualify.

Written permission for a substitute showman must be obtained from the Livestock Event Manager. When an exhibitor has more than one animal in the same class, one animal may be exhibited by another youth member without obtaining special permission.

Inspection

All animals of all species in the junior breeding division are governed by the rules and regulations of the American Royal Livestock Show and are subject to visual, physical and biological screening and inspection by the American Royal Veterinarian and Show Officials. Any violation of the code of ethics, animal abuse, fraud or misrepresentation will be dealt with on an individual basis. Any market or breeding animal exhibitor that is disqualified for any infraction of the rules or code of ethics violations will forfeit all premiums and proceeds. Every exhibitor, by entering an animal for exhibition, agrees to submit the entry for inspection if requested; exhibitor then releases the American Royal Association and/or its officers or show officials from all claims or demands arising from subsequent action taken by the Executive Committee.

Feed and Bedding

Feed may be purchased from the feed department. Exhibitors must furnish their own feed pans, buckets, and other equipment necessary to care for their animals. Cattle ties and the tie-out area will be bedded with material provided by the American Royal, additional bedding may be purchased from the Feed Room. Breeding Gilt exhibitors may purchase bedding from the feed department or bring their own.

Showmanship Contests

Any exhibitor showing in a Junior Breeding Show may enter the respective Showmanship Contest. There will be separate contests for steers, swine, goat, and lamb. Breeding gilts will show with market barrows. Weather Dams will show with market lambs. Breeding Does will show with market goats. Junior Breeding Heifers will show in their respective contest based on the week their breed is exhibiting.

The entry fee is \$10.00 per contest if included on entry form. Exhibitors may enter at the time of arrival for a fee of \$30.00 per contest. Contests will be divided into classes by age after check-in. Exhibitors must use their own animal that is properly entered in the 2023 American Royal Livestock Show. They may not bring an animal exclusively for the Showmanship Contest. Fitting will be optional for cattle. Please see your respective breed section for information on age divisions.

Banners will be presented to age-division winners and awards will be presented to the Overall Champion and Reserve Champion in each species. In addition, the BOTAR Organization will award \$150 to the Champion Showman in each species.

Exhibitors participating in showmanship will be required to wear an American Royal Livestock Show shirt. These shirts may be picked up with your exhibitor packet upon arrival, or in the show office.

Breeding Gilt Rules

1. All General Rules and Regulations of the American Royal apply.
2. **An exhibitor may enter three breeding gilts.**
3. Absolutely no extra or alternate breeding gilts (breeding gilts not entered in the show) will be allowed on the grounds.
4. Ownership deadline for crossbred breeding gilts is August 15th, 2023 and DNA Validation Samples must be on file with the American Royal on or before that deadline.
5. Ownership deadline for pedigreed breeding gilts is September 10th, 2023. Pedigreed entries must be registered Berkshire, Chester, Duroc, Hampshire, Hereford/ Tamworth, Landrace, Poland, Spot, or Yorkshire gilts.
6. Ownership deadline for Crossbred gilts is August 15th, 2023. Crossbred gilts will have their own division.
7. All breeding gilts must be **farrowed on or after February 1st, 2023.**
8. **Breeding Gilts will be penned by arrival.** Mandatory 2 pigs per pen. Dividers are encouraged. No tack pens. Pens are strictly on a first-come, first-serve basis. Due to limited space, no exhibitor will be allowed to reserve pens except special circumstances with permission from show management.
9. All breeding gilt exhibitors must be a member of NJSA or Team Purebred unless they have only crossbred gilts.
10. **All breeding gilt exhibitors must follow NJSA age requirements if they are showing a Berkshire, Duroc, Hampshire, Landrace, Yorkshire, and Crossbred.** The exhibitor must be 21 years old or younger as of January 1 of the current year, but the member must be able to exhibit their pig on their own with no assistance from ANYONE, including parents, siblings, NJSA Junior Board, NSR Staff, American Royal Staff, etc. Special arrangements can be made beforehand for exhibitors that need it.
11. **All breeding gilt exhibitors must follow Team Purebred age requirements if they are showing a Chester, Hereford/Tamworth, Poland, Spot, or Crossbred gilt.** The exhibitor must be 21 years old or younger as of January 1 of the current year, but the member must be able to exhibit their pig on their own with no assistance from ANYONE, including parents, siblings, Team Purebred Junior Board, Team Purebred Staff, American Royal Staff, etc. Special arrangements can be made beforehand for exhibitors that need it.
12. Once moved-in breeding gilts may not leave the barn until released. Breeding gilts may be exercised in the barn or show arena if available.
13. The act of artificially filling animals internally, which includes stomach pumping, drench tubes, bottles, syringes, suckle bottles, or any other method per os (by esophagus) is prohibited on the American Royal grounds.



14. No cots or other sleeping accommodations will be allowed in the barn.
15. All breeding gilts must have an official health certificate issued by an accredited veterinarian in the state of origin.
16. Substitutions must be made with the current 2023 American Royal Substitution Form, which can be found on the American Royal website. Exhibitors may substitute between breeds. **Substitution forms must include both signatures and credit card information to be accepted. Deadline is September 25th.** Exhibitors wishing to substitute after September 25th, must obtain the approval of the American Royal Livestock Office before the exhibitor/animal arrives on the grounds.

Late Substitutions will be accepted all the way up to the show for a late fee of \$100.00 and you must receive approval from the Livestock Office of the Substitution before the animal arrives on the grounds.

17. Shakers, downers, and any other unfit hogs will not be allowed to show.



18. Purebred/Crossbred divisions will be broken into classes based on weight at the discretion of the superintendent.



19. The American Royal will be using a weigh back system for Purebred/Crossbred Gilts. A weight card will be obtained when the exhibitor obtains their exhibitor packet. The purebred/crossbred gilt exhibitor must fill out and turn in the weight card at check-in with a called/declared weight. This will become the animal's official weight. The judge will determine the number of weigh backs. No reweighs will be allowed once the animal has stepped off the scale. There will be a 15-pound tolerance from the declared weight and all animals outside of the 15-pound tolerance will be disqualified. The maximum weight for Crossbred gilts is 375 pounds. No maximum weight for Purebred gilts.
20. All clipping and/or shearing of hogs is prohibited on the grounds of the American Royal. No hogs may be restrained on the grounds of the American Royal by snare, wire, rope, or other means unless under the supervision and/or direction of the show office or the official veterinarian.
21. An exhibitor, by virtue of their entry and presence at the show, is expected to allow their animal(s) to be used in 4-H, FFA, or college judging contests if selected by breed association or the American Royal staff.
22. Exhibitors are responsible for keeping pens clean and will provide their own feed and water. Feed may be purchased from the feed department. Exhibitors must furnish their own feed pans, buckets, and other equipment necessary to care for their animals. Breeding Gilt exhibitors may purchase bedding from the Feed Room or bring their own.

National Junior Swine Association and Team Purebred Breeding Gilt

Purebred breeding gilt classes will be established as numbers warrant for registered Berkshire, Chester, Duroc, Hampshire, Hereford/Tamworth, Landrace, Poland, Spotted, and Yorkshire. At least 10 hogs of a breed must be checked-in at the show for a breed division. If fewer than 10 hogs of a particular breed are checked-in they will show in an Other Registered Purebred Division. No registered hogs of the aforementioned 9 breeds will show in the crossbred division. The above purebred classes are sponsored by their respective breed associations. There will be no other breed classes.

National Junior Swine Association Special Rules

Breed classes will be provided for purebred Berkshire, Duroc, Hampshire, Yorkshire, and Landrace Breeding Gilt. If fewer than 10 hogs of a breed are checked-in they will show in an Other Registered Purebreds Division. These four breeds must meet the following requirements:

1. All exhibitors must be members of the National Junior Swine Association.
2. Entries may be purchased females, but must be owned by the junior exhibitor, the exhibitor's family name or exhibitor's farm name by September 10th, 2023.
3. Breeding gilts must be registered in the junior exhibitor's name, exhibitor's family name, or exhibitor's farm name.
4. All animals are to be guaranteed negative of the stress gene to be exhibited at a NSR or NJSA event.
5. All Berkshire gilts must be stress negative and the stress status must be on the pedigree (HAL – 1843* nm must be under the pig's name on the pedigree).
6. NSR and NJSA reserve the right to randomly collect a DNA profile on exhibited animals for stress gene, parentage verification, and breed purity at any event where registered animals are exhibited. This collection will be supervised by NSR or NJSA representatives.
7. All Breed Champions, Reserve Champion and/or any randomly selected females may be blood tested for presence of the stress gene, parentage verification, and breed purity as DNA technology becomes available.
8. Any premiums will not be awarded until the DNA results are verified at the NSR office.
9. Any females that fail these DNA tests for the stress gene, parentage verification or breed purity will forfeit all premiums and awards. Showmanship standings, however, will not be affected by failed test results. If premiums and awards are not returned to NSR, the exhibitor will not be allowed to compete in future NJSA or NSR events.
10. Breeding gilts must meet all registration eligibility requirements of their respective breed associations. NSR field staff or qualified NSR representatives will inspect all females for breed eligibility.
11. Any hog disqualified by NJSA will also be disqualified by the American Royal and all monies will be withheld.
12. All other rules of the junior breeding show apply.

Team Purebred Special Rules

Breed classes will be provided for purebred Chester, Hereford/Tamworth, Poland, and Spotted Breeding Gilts. If fewer than 10 hogs of a breed are checked-in, they will show in an Other Registered Purebreds Division. These 5 breeds must meet the following requirements:

1. All exhibitors must be members of Team Purebred.
2. Entries may be purchased females, but must be owned by the junior exhibitor, the exhibitor's family name or exhibitor's farm name by September 10th, 2023.
3. Breeding gilts must be registered in the junior exhibitor's name, exhibitor's family name, or exhibitor's farm name.
4. All open gilts shown in Team Purebred shows are guaranteed to be open and may be subject to random pregnancy checks.
5. Team Purebred reserves the right to randomly collect a DNA profile on exhibited animals for parentage verification and breed purity at any event where registered animals are exhibited. This collection will be supervised by Team Purebred representatives.
6. Any premiums due will not be awarded until all test results are verified at the Team Purebred office.
7. Any gilt that fails DNA tests for the stress gene, parentage verification or breed purity will forfeit all gilt show premiums, awards, and scholarships. If awards are not returned to Team Purebred, the exhibitor will not be allowed to compete in future Team Purebred events.
8. Breeding gilts must meet all registration eligibility requirements of their respective breed association. Team Purebred field staff or qualified representatives will check papers and inspect all gilts for breed eligibility.
9. Any gilt disqualified by Team Purebred, for any reason, will also be disqualified by the American Royal and all monies will be withheld.
10. All other rules of the junior breeding show apply.

Crossbred Breeding Gilts

Any gilt that does not qualify for the National Swine Registry and Team Purebred registered classes will show in this division. Ownership deadline for crossbred breeding gilts is August 15th, 2023 and **DNA Validation Samples must be on file with the American Royal on or before that deadline.**

3. Absolutely no extra or alternate lambs (lambs not entered in the wether dam ewe show) will be allowed on the grounds.
4. Classification Guidelines -
2023 American Royal Wether Dam Ewe Show will be classified into 2 Divisions: White Face-Influenced Ewes (i.e. Dorset, Southdown, Dorper, etc., and crosses using white face breeds i.e. speckle face) and Black Face Ewes. The decision of the classifier is final.
5. Ownership deadline is August 15, 2023.
6. The wether dam ewe show is open to youth who are no younger than 7 years old and no older than 21 years old as of January 1st, 2023
7. Junior wether dam ewes must be younger than 12 months old.
8. All junior wether dam ewes must be carrying temporary incisors (milk teeth) at time of show with no permanent incisors in view. Lambs with teeth that have been tampered with will be disqualified at the discretion of show officials.

8. Yearling wether dam does cannot be older than 24 months old and should have their two adult teeth in place.
9. Stalling will be assigned. No tack pens allowed until after arrival deadline except those assigned by the Superintendent.

Any exhibitor who does not comply promptly if requested by the management to remove a chute is subject to disciplinary action including forfeiture of premiums. Any exhibitor failing to have a Grooming Chute Permit clearly visible will be subject to having the stand removed from the grounds.

Classification

Steer momma heifers will not be shown by breeds. There is no minimum or maximum weight limit for steer momma heifers. All steer momma heifers will be weighed and divided by weight into classes at the discretion of the superintendent and the American Royal Livestock Event Manager. There will be no re-weighs. 1. All rules of the Junior Breeding Division apply.
2. American Royal entry forms properly filled out and accompanied by appropriate fees must be postmarked, or submitted online on or before September 10th, 2023.
3. Heifers must be registered solely in the junior exhibitor's name on or before September 10th, 2023. Animals registered in the family name or two or more juniors' names are not eligible to show in the junior show. This applies even if an animal is registered in a farm or ranch name and the junior member is the only person listed on that membership. Bred and owned animals must be owned solely by the junior exhibitor on or before September 10th, 2023. Only exception will be for Junior Futurity Heifers and entry fee must be made prior to start of the show.
4. All breeding animals exhibited in an AAA sponsored show must be recognized with the AAA and contain a minimum of fifty percent (50%) or greater American Aberdeen.
5. Any heifer not bearing a legible tattoo is ineligible to show and tattoo must match registration papers. This tattoo must be listed on the entry form.
6. All cattle must meet the health requirements set out by the show management. Any deviation will be just cause for immediate disqualification from the show.
7. Heifers will show by age in the classes listed below.
8. Show management reserves the right to break large classes if deemed necessary, in which case the monies may be split.
9. Any person found guilty of misrepresentation, or not abiding by the show rules, will be disqualified and denied the privilege of showing.
10. The Regional American Aberdeen Board has decided to have a Supreme American Aberdeen Junior Female. Following the junior show, the judge will select the Supreme of the percentage and fullblood with their selection then being the heifer eligible to compete for the Supreme Champion Junior Female.

Participation Statement

The American Angus Association, 3201 Frederick Ave, St. Joseph, MO, will participate in premiums offered in individual classes for junior Angus heifers, as included in its standard show classifications, according to the premium schedule based on the number of head shown. The premium assistance provided by the American Angus Association for participation in this show is in addition to the premiums offered by the show itself. The premium assistance should not be used to offset show expense and shall be included in the premium payments distributed by the show to the exhibitors.

A minimum of fifteen (15) head must be shown in the junior heifer Angus classes to receive American Angus Association premium participation. The show is not required to have all classes to be eligible for premiums. Separate classes for bred and owned heifers may be held if the size of the show merits a separate class.

Any classes listed that exceed 15 head per class should be broken into smaller classes by dividing the class as evenly as possible, without splitting animals with the same birth date. If there are more than 30 head in a division, the division should be split into Division 1, 2, etc. Class breaks will be at the discretion of the American Angus Association staff in attendance.

To be eligible for Association premiums, the entries must be recorded in the sole name of the junior exhibitor on or before September 10th, 2023. This ownership deadline applies to both owned and bred-and-owned females. The Association's contribution is included in the total premiums listed in each class.

Premiums from the Association are paid only to registered Angus cattle and only if the registration number is part of the show report provided to the Association. Therefore, all cattle should be registered at the time of entry to make certain they receive the Association's portion of the premiums.

The Association does not pay on premiums offered in championship classes. An animal may only be counted one time toward the total count for premium participation by the Association.

Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate issued by the American Angus Association available for inspection at the show for each animal or another current proof of ownership issued by the American Angus Association pedigree look up.

Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks, or hot branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification on its registration certificate is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-identified (tattooed/branded) and rechecked at the show.

Any female shown with a calf at side: the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and the calf must be registered by show day and have proof of registration at check-in.

Only one person at a time shall lead an animal into the show ring.

Exhibitors who participate in shows that accept premium monies contributed by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2; Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800-810. These rules can be found at www.angus.org.

Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the use of chin straps, covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), with the exception of false tail switches. The use of graphite, powders, hemp or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those used internally such as steroids, illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing.

At any show for which the American Angus Association appropriates funds toward the payment of premiums, no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a “white towel” or “white glove” test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated line up areas.

All animals exhibited are subject to DNA market or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.

Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

Age Requirement

Exhibitor’s must be ages 8-21 as of January 1 of the current year and must be a Junior, Regular or Life Member of the American Angus Association. Junior membership shall be issued only to an individual and shall expire upon attainment of age 21. Participation is acceptable through the calendar year of the individual’s 21st birthday. Special arrangements can be made beforehand for exhibitors that may need assistance while in the show ring.

Show management reserves the right to break large classes if deemed necessary, in which case the monies may be split.

2. The American Royal will keep \$80 of the per head entry fee.
3. Animals competing in the Black Hereford Show must be registered in the American Black Hereford Association herd book and recorded in the name of the exhibitor 30 days prior to the American Royal registration deadline.
4. Cattle must be owned solely by the junior exhibitor and in his/her recorded ownership 30 days prior to the show. Siblings may jointly own animals, provided both are members of the ABHA and meet ABHA age requirements. No animal is eligible to compete if recorded in joint ownership (other than the sibling rule), and no joint ownership with farm name or family name.
5. All animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must match registration papers. Any animal upon check-in, which does not have legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo) corresponding to the permanent identification on the registration certificate is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.
6. Altering the conformation or natural appearance of the animal is prohibited. This includes covering of white skin and the use of artificial tailheads, switches, or any use of false hair. Other prohibited products include illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals, or artificial filling. Any animal found in violation will be barred from showing.
7. Any winning animals in any and all divisions may be subject to DNA Parentage Verification (sire and dam only). If discrepancies in parentage are found the animal may be subject to forfeit its winning position and prize money premiums.
8. All cattle must meet the health requirements set out by the American Royal Management. Any deviation will be just cause for immediate disqualification from the show.
9. Any person found guilty of misrepresentation by the show and sale committee including the age of the animal, or not abiding by the show rules, will be disqualified and denied the privilege of show. Case may be referred to the ABHA for further action according to association procedure.
10. The registered owner and/or exhibitor must be a member in good standing with the ABHA.

2. Animals competing in the Braunvieh Show must be duly registered in the BAA Herd Book. A copy of the registration may be used for Braunvieh check-in. Any heifer not bearing a legible tattoo matching its registration paper is ineligible to show.
3. Heifers must be owned and registered solely in the junior exhibitor's name by Sept. 10, 2023. Animals registered in a family name or two or more juniors' names are not eligible to show in the junior show. 4. All animals exhibited must have a DNA profile on file with the Braunvieh Association of America. A DNA sample on the subject animal must be received by the BAA or BAA representative prior to the show

This will be a one division show in which Gelbvieh females and Balancer females will show together. There will not be a separation between the two breeds in the Junior Show. To qualify as a Balancer® all cattle must meet the American Gelbvieh Association's Balancer trademark rules for registration.

Gelbvieh cattle eligible for exhibition must meet the minimum Gelbvieh percentage of 75% to show. Females not meeting this minimum requirement, that do not qualify for the Balancer trademark (see below) will not be eligible for exhibition.

Balancer® cattle are a combination of 25 percent (1/4) to 75 percent (3/4) Gelbvieh and 25 percent (1/4) to 75 percent (3/4) Angus or Red Angus with a maximum of 12.5 percent (1/8) unknown or other breed.

To register a Balancer® animal the sire and dam must be recorded by an officially recognized organization (AGA, American Angus Association, Red Angus Association of America, Canadian Angus Association, Canadian Gelbvieh Association) and at least 75 percent of the pedigree must be known and documented by the AGA and/or another officially recognized registration association.

All cattle will be recognized by the breed percentage rules adopted by the AGA Board of Directors

Gelbvieh/Balancer Rules

National Rules

1. All cattle including calves on the side of the cow-calf pairs and senior yearlings entered must be registered in the Herd Book of the American Hereford Association (AHA). Entries with registrations “pending” or illegible tattoos or improper tattoos as shown on the registration certificate at check-in time are ineligible for competition. Exhibitors are subject to the Association’s special rule on class qualification. 3. Original registration papers must accompany all animals at time of check-in. Entries with registrations pending, illegible tattoos, or improper tattoos as shown on the registration certificate at check-in time are ineligible for competition. Simmental Rules

1. All rules of the Junior Breeding Division apply.
2. All animals must be registered with the American Simmental Association. Proof of registration must accompany all animals at the time of check-in. Original registration papers are recommended, but digital certificates (or printed copies) will also be accepted.
3. Any heifer not bearing a legible tattoo is ineligible to show and tattoo must match registration papers. This tattoo must be listed on the entry form.
4. No force stomach filling by pump or any other means will be allowed. Animals, owners, exhibitors, and fitter may be disqualified for such action.
5. Heifers must be registered solely in the junior exhibitor's name on or before September 10th, 2023. Animals registered in the family name or two or more junior's names are not eligible to show in the junior show. This applies even if an animal is registered in a farm or ranch name and the junior member is the only person listed on that membership. Bred and owned animals must be owned solely by the junior exhibitor on or before September 10th, 2023.
6. Heifers will show by age in the classes listed below.
7. Show management reserves the right to break large classes if deemed necessary, in which case the monies may be split.

Age Requirement

Simmental junior heifer exhibitors must be at least 8 years old and no older than 21 years old as of January 1, 2023. Regardless of age exhibitors are required to lead their own animals without assistance in the show ring.

Stanley E. Stout Memorial Supreme Heifer Scholarship

The Stanley E. Stout Memorial Supreme Heifer Scholarship has been established in honor of Stanley Stout, American Royal Board of Directors member and chairman of the livestock committee. Stanley may be best known throughout the region as “the auctioneering voice” of the American Royal purebred livestock auctions and the Junior Premium Auction.

The winner of the Supreme Champion Heifer will be awarded a \$10,000 scholarship. All other breed champions who are competing for the Supreme Champion will be awarded a \$500 or a \$1000 scholarship based on number of heifers shown in each breed over a 5 year average. The scholarship not only creates a legacy in the former community leader's name, but strengthens a foundation of support for youth in agriculture.

Scholarships are presented only for advanced educational purposes of the winners. The sums assigned annually as scholarship will be maintained by the American Royal until such time as the recipients have enrolled and demonstrate that said funds will be directed to scholarship purposes. These scholarships are non-transferable. The funds shall be paid directly to the college or institution of advanced learning and/or training as approved by the Executive Committee of the American Royal.

Bud Sloan Supreme Heifer Trophy

In the fall of 1971 Bud Sloan began doing seasonal contract work for the American Royal. With his vast experience and knowledge about cattle and marketing, Bud was the ideal candidate to lead the American Royal Livestock Show. Bud has been involved in the American Royal as either beef cattle superintendent or livestock superintendent for at least 44 years. Bud, along with his longtime colleague Stanley, were integral in forming a task force that reorganized the structure of the American Royal Livestock Show and established the show as it is known today. Bud was responsible in establishing the Stanley E. Stout Scholarship in the amount of \$10,000.00 for the exhibitor of the Supreme Champion Heifer at the American Royal.

In addition, because of Bud's efforts, each breed champion heifer receives a \$500.00 or a \$1000.00 scholarship based on the number of heifers shown in each breed over a 5 year average. Bud recognized the need to honor Stanley's mark on the industry as well as bring more financial assistance for continuing education to youth involved in agriculture.

The hope is that Bud's passion for cattle and the livestock industry will continue on through this trophy that was generously sponsored by Hartman Cattle Company, Tecumseh, Nebraska. This trophy will be awarded to the exhibitor of the Supreme Champion Breeding Heifer. The trophy will stay housed at the American Royal throughout the year.

Arrival and Release of Breeding Cattle

An earliest arrival time will be stated for some departments. An earlier arrival may necessitate staying outside the buildings. The management determines arrival and release times in an effort to make the best use of available space and to provide the best possible show for all exhibitors, special groups in attendance and the general public.

- For American Aberdeen, Belted Galloway, Black Hereford, Braunvieh, Gelbvieh, Limousin, Mini Herefords, Red Angus, Salers, and Watusi the American Royal barns will be available after 1:00 p.m. Thursday, October 5, 2023.
- For Angus, Charolais, Chianina, Hereford, Maine-Anjou, Shorthorn, and Simmental the American Royal barns will be available after 12:00 p.m. Tuesday, October 17th, 2023.

Exhibitors are expected to keep their livestock on display until the designated time for release unless the Livestock Event Manager grants permission for early release. Failure to comply with this rule can result in forfeiture of premiums. The stated release time should be considered when a decision to enter is made.

If necessary, to allow time for cleanup, exhibitors are expected to remove animals and tack from tie space promptly after release time if asked by the management to do so.

All animals, tack and equipment must be removed from the American Royal barns by 8:00 p.m. Monday, October 9th, 2023 for cattle exhibiting between the dates of October 5th-October 9th, 2023. All animals, tack, and equipment must be removed from the American Royal barns by 11:59 p.m. Sunday, October 22nd, 2023 for cattle exhibiting between the dates of October 17-22, 2023. No livestock or equipment may be left on the American Royal grounds after 6:00 p.m., Monday, October 23rd, 2023.

Grooming Chutes

Exhibitors may use grooming chutes or cattle safety devices. Space will not be guaranteed for grooming chutes. A grooming chute permit is available for \$35.00 per chute. Any exhibitor failing to have a grooming chute permit clearly visible will be subject to having chute removed from grounds. Chutes must be kept with exhibitors' cattle and cannot be placed in aisles, cleanout alleys, or fire lanes. Any exhibitor that does not comply promptly if requested by the management to remove a chute is subject to disciplinary action including forfeiture of premiums.

Tie and Tack Space

Superintendents will assign tie space and tack space as needed upon arrival. The per-head fee is an entry fee not space rental. Due to limited space, ties will be assigned for the actual number of cattle that arrive at the show.

Tie-Outs

Breeding cattle may not be tied-out until 5:30 p.m. Temporary tie-outs are available at no charge on a first-come basis. Because most cattle will be on the grounds at the same time, please be considerate of fellow exhibitors and only use the tie-out space needed. The American Royal does not guarantee tie-out space and is not liable for security, accidents or loss of animals or articles in tie-out area. Cattle tie-outs are temporary panels and, as such, may not be substantial enough for some animals. Exhibitors, who elect to tie-out at night, do so at their own risk and are responsible for the security of their own animals. No tents are allowed in the tie-outs.

Bedding

All cattle ties in the barn and the tie-out area will be bedded with material provided by the American Royal. The charge for bedding is included in the entry fee for all cattle. Additional bedding and feed may be purchased from the Feed Room. Orders must be placed by 4:00 p.m. daily. Terms are cash or credit card. All feed bills **MUST** be paid in full before orders will be delivered.

Substitution Rule

Substitutions may only be made with the breed entered and are only allowed in Junior Heifers and Open Cattle. Substitutions can be made only in the name of the original exhibitor/recorded owner as listed on the entry form and must be the same sex- bulls for bulls and females for females. Substitutions must be made with the current 2023 American Royal Substitution Form, which can be found on the American Royal website. **Forms submitted without the required signatures and/or credit card number will not be accepted.** The form must be received no later than **September 25th, 2023**. Substitution forms can be found under the Livestock section of the website. No substitutions will be allowed after September 25th, 2023 without the \$100.00 late substitution fee and you must alert American Royal Livestock Show management before you arrive on grounds of the animal.

Any substitutions made or attempted to be made in any breeding class through deceit may result in disqualification of all animals and parties involved. Said parties may be subject to subsequent actions by the Executive Committee.

Cattle Sales

Breed sales are under the management of the respective Associations. Sale managers or breed associations are requested to furnish the Livestock Department with a summary of their sales including totals and averages.

All live animals entered in any sale at the American Royal must be properly entered in the respective American Royal show. Owners are responsible for submitting completed entry forms along with required fees. **Sale management must send a complete list of owners/sale animals to the American Royal by September 10th, 2023.**

Health Requirements

Health requirements are located in the General Information section. All livestock entering this show will be subject to examination by a show or State Veterinarian upon arrival or during the show.

Animals with active lesions of ringworm with resulting loss of hair, or multiple warts visible will not be permitted to exhibit. If animals have had ringworm, lesions must be dried and healed with hair growing back in. Any animal, of any species, showing evidence of infectious, contagious, or communicable diseases will be immediately withdrawn from the show,

removed from the grounds, or held in quarantine at owner's risk and expense. These animals must remain in the quarantine area while on the grounds. There will be no refund of entry or other fees on animals withdrawn.

Parking and Passes

Entry gates will be supervised. All exhibitors are required to purchase a minimum of one exhibitor badge, if traveling with someone else, it is not necessary to purchase a parking pass. A parking fee of \$10.00 per vehicle per entry and an admissions fee of \$5.00 per person per entry will be charged at the entry gates if passes are not purchased. See General Information for details on vehicle passes and grounds passes.

Additional Information

Nurse cows will not be permitted.

Only animals entered in the show are allowed on the grounds.

Animals recorded in more than one breed registry may only show in one breed show. Animals must show in the same breed in the open and junior show, if eligible.

American Aberdeen Show Rules

1. American Royal entry forms properly filled out and accompanied by appropriate fees must be postmarked or submitted online on or before September 10th, 2023.
2. All animals exhibited must be recorded in the name of the exhibitor by September 10th, 2023. A copy of the registration paper or an affidavit of registration must accompany each animal to the show. It is not necessary to mail registration certificates with entries. This will be a four-division show: 1) Purebred/Percentage Bulls 2) Fullblood Bulls 3) Purebred/Percentage Females 4) Fullblood Females. Group classes may contain both Fullblood and Purebred/Percentage animals.
3. All breeding animals exhibited in an AAA sponsored show must be recognized with the AAA and contain a minimum of fifty percent (50%) or greater American Aberdeen.
4. Proof of satisfactory semen evaluation for bulls born prior to May 1st, 2023 must be submitted at time of check-in.
5. Cattle must be entered and exhibited under the recorded ownership at the time of show entry deadline. Jointly owned animals must be entered and shown under the multi-ownership (all co-owners) in the individual classes.
6. All cattle must be properly tattooed, including herd prefix and will be inspected at the show. Tattoo must be legible and must match registration papers.
7. All cattle must meet the health requirements set out by the show management. Any deviation will be just cause for immediate disqualification from the show.
8. All bulls born before January 1st, 2023 must show with a nose lead. The right to disqualify from the show any animal deemed unmanageable is reserved by the show officials.
9. Any female with a calf at side, regardless of age, must show in the Cow-Calf class. All females born before August 31, 2021 through April 30, 2022 must be accompanied by a verification of pregnancy signed by a licensed veterinarian. Exception to the rule of safe in calf will apply to: 1) a donor female that has produced fertile eggs in the previous twelve (12) months as verified in a written statement from a licensed veterinarian or 2) females shown with calf at side.
10. All females shown in Cow-Calf class with a calf over 150 days of age must be bred back and must be accompanied by a verification of pregnancy signed by a licensed veterinarian.
11. Cow-Calf classes- any female with a calf at side, regardless of age, must show in the Cow-Calf class. Calf must be cow's natural calf. Cows that are exhibited with calved at the side must be lactating. Calves must not exceed 270 days of age on day of judging and must be nursing. Calf entries in the Cow-Calf class may be shown individually providing individual entry has been made. Cows may be evaluated and screened out of the show on the basis of udder quality. The determination of the show committee will be final.
12. Any person found guilty of misrepresentation, or not abiding by the show rules, will be disqualified and denied the privilege of showing in this year's shows and/or future shows.

Premiums

Premiums will be paid through 3rd place in each class. First place in each individual class will receive fifty dollars (\$50) and the remainder of the premium money will be awarded to 2nd and 3rd place on a graduated basis after the show has been completed. The American Royal awards ribbons to the prize winners in class, rosettes to the division champions and reserve champions and banners to the Grand Champions.

Show management reserves the right to break large classes, if deemed necessary, in which case the monies may be split

Angus Rules

Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible permanent identification mark (eat tattoo marks, freeze-branded marks or hot-branded marks) corresponding to the permanent identification mark on the registration certificate is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-identified (tattooed/branded) and rechecked at the show.

Any female shown with a calf at side: the calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf, and the calf must be registered by show day and have proof of registration at check-in.

Only one person at a time shall lead an animal into the show ring.

Exhibitors who participate in shows by the American Angus Association are subject to the Association Rules as found in the Breeders Reference Guide of the Association. These rules are found in Part 2; Association Rules. The rules relating directly with the exhibition of Angus cattle are Part 2: Association Rules; Rule 800 Series; including Rule 800-810. These rules can be found at www.angus.org.

Altering the conformation and/or appearance of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the use of chin straps, covering of white skin, false tail heads (or use of any false hair), with the exception of false tail switches. The use of graphic, powders, hemp or other similar substances used externally are also prohibited. Other prohibited products include those internally such as steroid, illegal, or unlicensed pharmaceuticals or artificial filling. Any animal found to be in violation will be barred from showing.

At any show by the American Angus Association no exhibitors, individuals assisting exhibitors or member owners at such show shall be allowed to use any coloring agents, on any animal exhibited. The Association may adopt and implement various tests designed to monitor this prohibition, including but not limited to a "white towel" or "white glove" test. No aerosol cans or other pressurized containers will be allowed in designated line up areas.

All animals exhibited are subject to DNA marker or blood type test to verify accuracy of parentage as covered under the Association Rules and for other testing as required by the individual show.

Authorized representatives of the Association have the authority to enforce the rules set forth herein as well as in the Association Rules, including the barring of a registered animal from a livestock show at which it is to be shown, if there are reasonable grounds to believe a violation has occurred.

American Angus Association Show Classification

Only registered Angus cattle that meet the age requirements listed within this classification are eligible to receive premium participation and be counted in the total number of head shown. Champion and Reserve Champion placings are not counted in the number of head shown.

The individual classes will be made up and divided after the cattle are checked in at the show. They will be judged from the youngest class to the oldest class with each class made up of no more than fifteen (15) head. Any classes listed that exceed 15 head per class should be broken into smaller classes by dividing the class as evenly as possible without splitting animals with the same birth date. If there are more than 30 head in a division should be split in to Division 1, 2, etc. Class breaks will be at the discretion of the American Angus Association staff in attendance.

Females

Any female that qualifies for female classes in the Association's standard classifications are not eligible to show in the cow-calf classes. However, the calf at side of the female is eligible to show in its respective class providing individual entry has been made.

Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Cow-Calf pairs do not show for Grand Champion Female and are ineligible to compete in the get-of-sire, junior get-of-sire and breeder's six-head classes.

2. The American Royal will keep \$80 of the per head entry fee.
3. Animals competing in the Black Hereford Show must be registered in the American Black Hereford Association herd book and recorded in the name of the exhibitor 30 days prior to the American Royal registration deadline.
4. Cattle must be entered under the recorded ownership 30 days prior to show. Jointly owned animals must be entered under the multi-ownership (all co-owners) in the individual classes.

5. All animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must match registration papers. Any animal upon check-in, which does not have legible permanent identification mark (ear tattoo) corresponding to the permanent identification on the registration certificate is ineligible to show. Once disqualified due to an incorrect or illegible permanent identification mark, animals cannot be re-tattooed and rechecked at the show.
6. Altering the conformation or natural appearance of the animal is prohibited. This includes covering of white skin and the use of artificial tailheads, switches, or any use of false hair. Other prohibited products include illegal or unlicensed pharmaceuticals, or artificial filling. Any animal found in violation will be barred from showing.
7. Any winning animals in any and all divisions may be subject to DNA Parentage Verification (sire and dam only). If discrepancies in parentage are found the animal may be subject to forfeit its winning position and prize money premiums.
8. All cattle must meet the health requirements set out by the American Royal Management. Any deviation will be just cause for immediate disqualification from the show.
9. All bulls above one year of age must show with a nose lead. The right to disqualify from the show any animal deemed unmanageable is reserved by the show management.
10. Any person found guilty of misrepresentation by the show and sale committee including the age of the animal, or not abiding by the show rules, will be disqualified and denied the privilege of show. Case may be referred to the ABHA for further action according to association procedure.
11. The registered owner and/or exhibitor must be a member in good standing with the ABHA.
12. Judges will have no preview of competing cattle or meeting with show exhibitors prior to the show. This is to maintain impartiality for all competitors and judge.
13. Classes are subject to change based on the number of entries.
14. Percentage and Purebred females will be eligible to compete in the Grand Champion selection at the conclusion of the heifer show.
15. Percentage and Purebred bulls will be eligible to compete in the Grand Champion Selection at the conclusion of the bull show.
16. All American Royal rules apply.

1. Make entries through American Royal online system at www.americanroyal.com or be mailed to American Royal livestock show 1701 American Royal Court Kansas City, MO. 64102
2. Exhibitors must be members in good standing of the U.S. Belted Galloway Society, Inc.
3. Animals must be registered or recorded in Belted Galloway Society Herd Book or other Society recognized Herd Book.
4. Animals must be in good physical condition and typical of the breed in conformation. "Good physical condition" shall include but not be limited to the absence of any infectious condition such as ringworm or warts.
5. Original registration or recordation papers will be required at check in. Any animal without a legible tattoo will not be allowed to show.
6. Bull over 12 months of age are required to wear a nose ring, either temporary or permanent, and must have a lead attached when being lead.
7. All bulls exhibited must have two descended testicles. No cryptorchids will be allowed.
8. Bulls exhibited at 16 months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate documenting they have passed a bull soundness exam.
9. Females that are 26 months or younger are eligible to show in the heifer classes. Females that are 27 months of age or older must show in the Cow/Calf class with a calf at side. Calves exhibited in the cow/calf class cannot be over 230 days of age. All cows must be lactating, and all calves must be nursing.
10. Animals must be purebred and registered in the herd book to qualify for the pureblood show. Pureblood, properly marked heifers, Pureblood Bulls, pureblood steers, and purebred mismarked heifers.
11. Percentage Belted Galloway animals must be recorded in the herd book to be eligible to be exhibited in the percentage Belted Galloway show, which would include percentage heifers and steers.
12. Percentage steers and heifers may be not be exhibited in group classes.
13. The order of the show will be purebred, properly marked heifers, cow/calf, bulls, and group classes, followed by purebred steers, percentage steers, purebred mis-marked heifers and percentage heifers.
14. The Show committee reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include any injection of gas, solid, or liquid under the skin to alter conformation, any additions of artificial tail heads or polls, any surgical alteration of the animal's shape, as well as any dyeing of coloring which alters the animal's natural color pattern. Artificially filling animals internally (pumping) is strictly prohibited.

Braunvieh Rules

1. American Royal entry forms, properly filled out and accompanied by the appropriate fees must be postmarked, or submitted online by September 10th, 2023.
2. The American Royal will keep \$80 of the per head entry fee and the balance will be remitted to the Association to be used for premiums.
3. The rules of the Braunvieh Association of America (BAA) and American Royal Livestock Show will govern the show.
4. Animals competing in the Braunvieh Show must be duly registered in the BAA Herd Book. A copy of the registration may be used for Braunvieh check-in. Each animal must bear a legible tattoo matching its registration paper.
5. Exhibitors must be in good standing with the BAA.
6. All animals exhibited must have a DNA sample on file with the Braunvieh Association of America. A hair, tissue, or blood sample on the subject animal must be received by the BAA or BAA representative prior to the show. Nursing calves showing only at side of their dam are exempt from the DNA requirement. If nursing calves show in individual classes, they must have a DNA sample on file.
7. All animals exhibited must have a known Braunvieh dam or sire and are subject to DNA verification.
8. Animals must be Fullblood or Purebred to qualify for the FB/PB Braunvieh Show. Braunvieh Beef Builders will be shown in a separate Beef Builder Show. Cattle recorded as "Braunvieh Influence" with a "BI" prefix are not eligible.
9. The BAA reserves the right to provide the judge and audience with the Expected Progeny Difference (EPD) values, ultrasound data (collected by a certified technician), scrotal circumference for bulls, weights and ratios for performance and weights with weight-per-day of age. Performance figures, (including weights, hip heights, and frame scores), can be presented in their entirety or any combination deemed necessary by the BAA.
10. Heifers born Sept. 1, 2021, and after will show in the heifer show but can show with natural calves at side and still be eligible to show for champion female/heifer.
11. Heifers exhibited at 20 months of age or older (not females in cow/calf class) must be pregnant and accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy by a licensed veterinarian, or show with a natural calf at side. Any protest on pregnancy will be handled with a blood test to prove the pregnancy status.
12. Females born on or prior to Aug. 30, 2021, must show in the cow/calf class with a natural born calf at side. The pair will not be eligible for champion female/heifer. The registration status of the cow (FB/PB or Beef Builder) will determine the division the pair shows in. Calves from the cow/calf class can be no more than 230 days of age by date of show and calves can also be entered as individuals in the show (additional entry fee).

Special Rules

All animals to be eligible for an Open Charolais Breeding Class must be purebred and registered with the American-International Charolais Association (AICA). Only bona fide (original) certificates of registration will be accepted as evidence of registration and ownership; NO PHOTOCOPIES.

An animal is eligible to enter or compete in an open Charolais breeding class if registered in country of origin outside the United States and is eligible for purebred registry in the AICA Herdbook.

Animals registered in the AICA Colored Division Registry (QF and QM initialed registration numbers) must meet the qualifications of the AICA rules and regulations.

All animals to be eligible may be approved by a sifting committee designated by the AICA. Stall space will not be provided for any Charolais cattle that have not been accepted by the sifting committee.

All animals are subject to a medical examination in order to determine age, and each animal will be present in the show ring in its natural conformation without alteration or modification. Use of artificial tailheads is not permitted.

Any animal not having a legible tattoo or firebrand number is ineligible and will be barred from showing.

Bulls from classes 18, 19, 21, and 23 must have a valid, satisfactory semen test certificate in possession. This certificate is valid for the entire show season.

All animals shown in individual classes must be weaned, with the exception of the Cow-Calf Class and calves at the side of females calved after September 1, 2021. Calves at side must be purebred and registered with the AICA. Females calved after September 1, 2021, must show in individual female class appropriate to age. Nurse cows are not permitted.

All females 20 months and older exhibited at AICA sanctioned shows must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side.

AICA requires that all animals be shown with a halter and suggest that all bulls be shown with a nose lead.

ALL EXHIBITS OF CHAROLAIS BREEDING CATTLE SHALL BE GOVERNED BY THE AICA RULES AND REGULATIONS, ARTICLE XV, TITLED EXHIBITION OF ANIMALS. THE INSPECTION OF EXHIBIT CATTLE IS SPECIFIED IN ARTICLE XV, PARAGRAPH C, OF THE ASSOCIATION RULES AND REGULATIONS AND NON-COMPLIANCE OF EXHIBIT INSPECTION IS SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH D OF THE SAME ARTICLE XV.

ARTICLE XV, PARAGRAPH B, POINT 2: "Each animal will be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure without alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical or other including banding or other circulatory constriction) appearance change for cosmetic purpose, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. The act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method per os (by esophagus) is prohibited. Silicone injection or other injection for cosmetic purpose shall be prohibited. Anabolic steroid use shall likewise be prohibited and any animal testing positive for anabolic steroid or diuretic use shall be presumed to be altered and modified."

Effective October 23, 2004, at any American-International Charolais Association (AICA) sanctioned show (including shows receiving AICA premium funding and/or qualifying as a Roll of Excellence Show), the use of a coloring agent, flock

and powder is prohibited. Use of these products will result in the immediate disqualification of a given animal at such show.

If circumstances exist and / or allow, AICA reserves the right to split large individual classes after the check-in procedure is complete.

1. All entries must be made on or before September 10, 2023 and are non-refundable.
2. All entries must be made by active adult or junior members in current account standing with the ACA. All entries are subject to provisions and rules set forth by the Board of Directors of the ACA.
3. ACA registration papers must be presented to the breed superintendent at the show. All animals with a tattoo not corresponding with its ACA registration paper will be ineligible to show. All animals must be registered with the ACA. Pending registrations are not accepted.
4. Breeding cattle born on or after January 1, 2012 must have a minimum of 6.25% Chianina blood in order to participate in ACA nationally sponsored shows such as the American Royal.
5. The attempted surgical or non-surgical alteration or conformation of an animal is strictly prohibited, except for dehorning. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation.
 - a. Scurs or scur tissue cannot be altered or removed (surgically or otherwise) from Chiangus born after January 1, 1992 unless they have been genetically tested and found to be polled. Cattle showing as Chiangus or Red Chiangus that are determined to have heads that have been altered, must produce a DNA test whose results have found the animal to be polled, in order to show as a Chiangus.
6. The use of false tail heads, added hair or other materials to any part of the animal's body is prohibited.
7. The dying or artificial changing of the existing color and color pattern is prohibited.
8. No artificial filling (pumping).
9. Classes will be broke after all animals are checked in at the show. Individual classes will be divided as equally as possible depending on the ages and number of animals entered.
10. There will be a cow/calf class in each division and the class winner will show for Grand Champion. Calves exhibited in the cow/calf division are not allowed to show in individual classes. All cows and calves must be registered with the ACA. The maximum age for calves is 260 days. No maximum age limit on the cows. The registration category of the cow determines the division in which the pair shows. Calves shown at the cow's side must be the cow's natural calf. The exhibitor may be asked to allow the calf to nurse the cow.
11. All females 18 months and older exhibited in the open show must have a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side.
12. All bulls show in individual classes must have a permanent nose ring and an attached lead.
13. All Grand Champions & Reserve Grand Champions shall have DNA (hair samples) collected at the conclusion of the show. The DNA shall be collected by an ACA staff member, plus two additional ACA representatives (staff and/or adult board members).

Animals recorded in more than one breed registry may only show in one breed show. Animals must show in the same breed in the open and junior show, if eligible.

Gelbvieh & Balancer Ring of Gold Point Show

This will be a two-division show: Gelbvieh and Balancer cattle. A Balancer is a specific hybrid registered by the American Gelbvieh Association with the following breed composition and documentation requirements:

- A combination of $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ Gelbvieh and $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ Angus or Red Angus with a maximum of $\frac{1}{8}$ unknown or other breed and
- The sire and dam must be recorded by an officially recognized organization (AGA, American Angus Association or Red Angus Association of America) and
- At least 75% of the pedigree must be known and documented by the AGA and/or another officially recognized registration association.

Note: 75% females and bulls that qualify to be registered as a Balancer or Gelbvieh can be entered and shown in only one division and may NOT be switched after entry deadline.

Gelbvieh/Balancer Rules

1. American Royal entry forms properly filled out and accompanied by the appropriate fees must be postmarked or submitted online by September 10th, 2023.
2. The Royal will keep \$80.00 per head entry fee and the balance will be used for premiums.
3. All animals exhibited must be recorded in the name of the exhibitor by September 10th, 2023. A copy of the registration paper or an affidavit of registration must accompany each entry to the show. It is not necessary to mail registration certificates with entries. Gelbvieh females seventy-five (75%) percent to one hundred (100%) percent will show together in the Gelbvieh show. A 75% Gelbvieh female or bull that is 25% Angus or Red Angus can choose whether to show as Gelbvieh or Balancer at the time of entry. No changes can be made after entry deadline. To qualify for the Balancer Show all cattle must meet the American Gelbvieh Association's rules for registration as a Balancer. Exhibitor must designate Gelbvieh or Balancer as breed on the entry form.
4. Gelbvieh and Balancer cattle will each compete within their respective shows. Group classes can be made up of a combination of Gelbvieh and Balancer cattle, but no group can be entirely made up of Balancers.
5. Cattle must be entered and exhibited under the recorded ownership at the time of the show entry deadline date. Jointly owned animals must be entered and shown under the multi-ownership (all co-owners) in the individual classes.
6. All animals must be properly tattooed, including herd prefix, and will be inspected at the show. If that tattoo is illegible or does not correspond to registration certificate, the animal is ineligible to show or may be re-tattooed by the exhibitor and re-checked at the end of processing for a fee of \$100, payable at the time. Electric Identification (EID) tags and freeze brands are also acceptable forms of identification. EID tags must be printed on the registration certificate in order to be accepted at check-in. If EID is not printed on the registration certificate a tattoo, including herd prefix, must be present.
7. All cattle must meet the health requirements set out by the show management. Any deviation from the health requirements will be just cause for immediate disqualification from the show.
8. Show committee prohibits the use of powders of any color. False tailheads or glued-on hair or hair-like substances are prohibited. Any use of glue to alter the natural conformation of the animals will be an automatic disqualification.

9. Proof of satisfactory semen evaluation for bulls twelve (12) months of age or older as of December 31 must be submitted at the time of check-in. Bulls over two (2) years of age must have a semen evaluation certificate issued within 90 days of the show.
10. **ALL BULLS MUST SHOW WITH A NOSELEAD.** Entry into the show ring without one will be an automatic disqualification. The right to disqualify from the show any animal deemed unmanageable is reserved by the Show Officials.
11. All females entered in junior yearling and senior yearling classes must be accompanied by a verification of pregnancy signed by a licensed veterinarian. Exception to the rule of "safe in calf" will apply to a donor female that has produced fertile eggs in the current year, as verified in a written statement from a licensed veterinarian.
12. All females shown in the cow-calf class with a calf over 150 days of age must be bred back and must be accompanied by a verification of pregnancy signed by a licensed veterinarian. Age of calf must not exceed 240 days as of the date of the show.
13. Any person found guilty of misrepresentation or not abiding by the show rules will be disqualified and denied the privilege of showing.
14. All protests against exhibitors, dealing with age or genetic background of show cattle, must be in writing and signed by five (5) active members of the AGA and accompanied by a deposit of \$500.00 cash or certified check which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of complain or appeal and must be delivered to the office of the Livestock Event Manager within one hour after the occasion of such protest, or if age is brought into question, on the day prior to the one on which the animals are to be judged.
15. The AGA follows the National Show Ring Code of Ethics. If these codes of ethics are violated, disciplinary action will be taken by the AGA Executive Committee.

EPDS will be available in the show program and given to the judge to use at his discretion.

American Royal National Hereford Show Rules

1. American Royal entry forms properly filled out and accompanied by appropriate fees must be postmarked, or submitted online on or before September 10th, 2023.
2. All cattle including calves on the side of cow-calf pairs and senior yearlings entered must be registered in the Herd Book of the American Hereford Association (AHA). Entries with registrations “pending” or illegible tattoos or improper tattoos as shown on the registration certificate at check-in time are ineligible for competition. Exhibitors are subject to the Association’s special rule on class qualification. Entries in these classes are accepted with the understanding that the exhibitor agrees to abide by the rule in all respects.
3. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed.
4. Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the use of graphite, hemp or other similar substances externally and steroid or growth stimulants internally.
5. The act of artificially filling animals internally, which includes stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method by mouth or esophagus is prohibited.
6. All animals shown in group classes must have been shown must have been shown in their respective single age class. No transfer from (1) breed to another, after entry, will be permitted.
7. Expected Progeny Difference (EPD) values will be provided to the judge and audience for all animals shown. Animals without EPD data are eligible to show, but will have N/A (not available) in place of missing data.
8. Any animal without a legible tattoo will not be eligible to show.
9. All Hereford animals must be officially recorded (registered) prior to show date to be eligible to show at a National Hereford Show.
10. An animal that is scurred (Scurs are small, rudimentary horns that are loosely attached to the head, which are considered to be expressed only in animals that are genetically heterozygous for the polled gene) will show in the polled division of Hereford shows. Once an animal is confirmed to be scurred by an AHA field representative, then this designation will be placed on the animal’s registration papers. Once this determination has been made and reported to the AHA office, then the owner may remove the scurs. Animals with scurs removed will show in the polled division of Hereford shows. Once an animal is confirmed polled or scurred they will retain this designation forever.
11. The individual classes will be made up and divided after the cattle are checked in at the show. They will be judged from the youngest class to the oldest within each class.
12. Calves on the side of cow-calf pairs MUST BE the cow’s natural calf and fully registered with the AHA..
13. It is recommended by the AHA Show Committee that classes with 10 or more head be considered to be split, depending on animals’ birthdates in each particular class.
14. If the number of classes in a division warrant, a division will be split into multiple divisions.

Awarded with the following point system:

No points will be given for champions. Points will be awarded for the Get-of-Sire and Best Six Head for Premier Exhibitor and Get-of-Sire for Premier Breeder. The same scoring system as above will be used for awarding points for the group classes.

Harry Darby Award – Armour Cup

The Armour Cup was the award for the Grand Champion Bull at the 1899 National Hereford Show which was the forerunner of the American Royal. The cup was lost for many years, but was found and purchased by the late Senator Harr Darby who gifted it to the American Royal Association to be used as a trophy for the Harry Darby Award to the exhibitor of the Grand Champion Hereford Bull. It is on permanent display in the American Hereford Association's Hereford Heritage Hall with the name of each year's winner engraved on a plate attached to the base of which the cup is displayed.

7. American Royal entry forms, properly filled out and accompanied by the appropriate fees, must be postmarked, or submitted online on or before September 10th, 2023. Include tattoo as well as registration number on the entry form. Cattle must be entered in the same name that appears on the animal's registration certificate as the current owner.
8. The American Royal will keep a \$80.00 per head entry fee and the balance will be remitted to the North American Limousin Foundation's portion of the premiums is paid to the American Royal to be included in their premium checks to exhibitors.
9. Animals must be registered with the North American Limousin Foundation.
10. All cattle shown including calves at the side of the dam must be:
 - a. 75% Limousin (NALF percentage, not actual) or greater as indicated on orange NALF registration certificates
Or
 - b. Purple-papered Lim-Flex cattle as indicated by NALF registration certificates.

Percentage, Fullblood, Purebred and Lim-Flex cattle shall compete in the same classes and championships

11. If a show does not abide by the NALF MOE show rules exhibitors will not be awarded points for that show.
12. Animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show Tattoos must be legible and match the registration certificates. If an animal's tattoo is not legible or cannot be read upon initial processing, it will be ineligible to show and not allowed to return with a new or corrected tattoo. Tattoo MUST have the **prefix, year code AND number**.
13. To maintain a high degree of confidence in Limousin shows, NALF reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical matter. Unethical fitting shall include the following:
 - a. Any use of paints, colored show foam, graphite, colored powders, or any other substance; animals subject to white towel test.
 - b. The addition of any hair or hair like substances, including false tailheads and false polls (false tail switches are allowed).
 - c. The cutting, tearing, or gluing of the hide or underneath the hide or removal of tissue in an attempt to alter the shape of the animal or the injection of any gas, solid, or liquid under the hide to alter the normal confirmation.
 - d. Any products, solutions, liquids administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal is prohibited. This includes the use of steroids, growth stimulants, and the act of artificially filling animals internally which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes or any other methods.

Exceptions: In the case of severely sick or severely dehydrated animals, the exhibitor may have fluids or electrolytes administered by the licensed official show veterinarian with the approval of the show superintendent and/or NALF representative. This exception is not applicable on show day or weigh-in/check-in day.

14. Bulls older than one (1) year of age must show with a nose lead. The Limousin Show Superintendent and the show management reserve the right to disqualify animals deemed unmanageable.
15. Protests against exhibitors, individual animals or fitting violations must be submitted in writing, signed by five (5) active members of the NALF and presented to the show superintendent within 12 hours of the show's completion. See Protests in the Rules and Regulations.
16. NALF reserves the right to mouth animals for dental development.
17. NALF reserves the right to collect hair samples from any animal.
18. Classes and Championship breaks will be determined after all the cattle have been check-in. Class sizes all be to the direction of the show superintendent and may not contain more than 20 head. The given classes may be split or combined only within their given division.
19. Premiums will be awarded as follows: 1st place in the individual classes will receive \$65.00. Any additional premiums may be pro-rated based on the total number of entries.
20. Calves exhibited alongside dams in the cow-calf division are eligible to show as individuals.
21. Animals shown must be solid red or black above the flanks, excluding birth marks.
22. Following the selection of the Grand and Reserve Female and the Cow/Calf Champion and Reserve Champion there will be the selection of Supreme Female to be chosen from the Grand Champion Female and the Champion Cow/Calf Pair. Supreme Female will not receive additional MOE points.

Other Requirements

The following performance data submission requirements must be met by Dec. 1 to receive Medal of Excellence Points:

- a) Birth weight (bulls and heifers)
- b) Weaning weight (bulls and heifers)
- c) Yearling weight (bulls and heifers)
- d) Yearling scrotal circumference (bulls)
- e) Pregnancy test (any female older than 600 days at seasons end)
- f) Breeding soundness exam and semen test (all bulls older than 400 days old)

NOTE: Failure to have performance data on file at NALF will result in disqualification from the MOE program and no points will be awarded. It is the responsibility of the breeder/owner/exhibitor to submit that information, without special requests from NALF.

Creditability Requirement

To maintain a high degree of integrity and credibility in all Limousin shows, all owners and exhibitors are expected to adhere to all North American Limousin Foundation rules and regulations regarding exhibition of Limousin cattle, and to adhere to the rules and regulations of particular shows, fairs, and exhibitions.

Maine-Anjou Rules

1. Exhibitors are subject to all rules and regulations of the American Maine-Anjou Association. When entry is made, exhibitors agree to abide with the rules and regulations established by the AMAA as well as the rules of the show management. Entries found to be misrepresented, or persons not abiding by the show rules may be disqualified from showing.
2. All animals must be registered in the AMAA or CMAA and the original certificate presented at check-in.
3. Tattoos will be checked, must be legible, and correspond exactly with the registration certificate. Other than a brucellosis calf hood tattoo, there shall be no permanent identification marks other than those noted on the certificate of registry.
4. The attempted surgical or non-surgical alteration or conformation of an animal is prohibited, except for dehorning. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation.
5. The use of false tailheads or adding hair or other material to any part of the animal's body is prohibited.
6. The dyeing or artificial changing of the existing color pattern and color will be prohibited.
7. All animals over 7 months of age must be dehorned.
8. Any and all cattle shall be made available to have blood drawn for parentage verification, detection of foreign substances or the presence of altering. If recorded parent is excluded as a results of blood typing, the owner may at his expense, request the AMAA to determine the actual parent. Failure to determine parentage will result in disqualification of that animal from the AMAA Herdbook.
9. Bulls 10 months of age and older must be shown with a bull lead in place.
10. Heifers exhibited at 20 months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy. For heifers used in embryo transfer, a certificate of positive fertility issued by a licensed veterinarian must be available for inspection.
11. Bulls exhibited at 14 months of age or older must have had a positive semen test and a certificate to that effect must be available for inspection.
12. Exhibitors shall wear show harnesses to exhibit entry numbers and performance data cards for all AMAA sponsored shows.
13. No acritical filling allowed.
14. Protests must be submitted in writing at least 24 hours prior to the beginning of judging or at the conclusion of judging. Written protests are accompanied by \$150 refundable fee and three (3) signatures of current AMAA members. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation and, depending on the basis of the protest a decision may be withheld until a complete investigation is made. All protests must also adhere to the American Royal protest rules found under Rules & Regulations in the American Royal premium book information.

Show management reserves the right to break large classes, if deemed necessary, in which case the monies may be split.

Animals recorded in more than one breed registry may only show in one breed show. Animals must show in the same breed in the open and junior show, if eligible.

1. American Royal entry forms properly filled out and accompanied by appropriate fees must be postmarked, or submitted online on or before September 10th, 2023.
2. The American Royal will keep \$80.00 of the per head entry fee and the balance will be remitted to the Miniature Hereford Breeders Association to be used for premiums.
3. All exhibitors must be current members of the Miniature Hereford Breeders Association to be eligible to show.
4. Cattle entered must be registered in the Herdbook of the American Hereford Association. Polled and Horned will show together in all miniature classes. Entries with registrations pending, illegible tattoos, or improper tattoos as shown on the registration certificate at check-in time are ineligible for competition. Maximum height at hop to be shown in these classes is 45" on mature females and 48" on mature bulls and steers. All entries will be measured at check-in. Those exceeding the height requirement will be disqualified from competition.
5. Entries are subject to provisions and rules for showing as set forth by the AHA Board of Directors and are subject to supervision of the Show and Sale Committee representing the MHBA.
6. Cattle must be entered and exhibited under the recorded ownership at the time of show entry deadline. Jointly owned animals must be entered and shown under the multi-ownership (all co-owners) in the individual classes.
7. All cattle must meet the health requirements set out by the show management. Any deviation will be just cause for immediate disqualification from the show.
8. All bulls born before January 1, 2023 must show with a nose lead. The right to disqualify from the show any animal deemed unmanageable is reserved by the show officials.

All females born September 1, 2021 through April 30, 2022 must be accompanied by a verification of pregnancy signed by licensed veterinarian. Exception to the rule of safe in calf will apply to: 1.) a donor female that has produced fertile eggs in the previous twelve (12) months as verified in a written statement from a licensed veterinarian of 2) females shown with calf at her side.
10. All females shown in Cow-calf classes with a calf over 150 days of age must be bred back and must be accompanied by a verification of pregnancy signed by a licensed veterinarian.
11. Cow-Calf- Any female with a calf at her side, regardless of age, must show in the Cow-Calf class. Calf must be cow's natural calf. Cows that are exhibited with calves at the side must be lactating. Calves must not exceed 240 days of age on day of judging and must be nursing. Calf entries in the Cow-Calf class may be shown individually providing individual entry has been made. Cows may be evaluated and screen out of the show on basis of udder quality. The determination of the show committee is final.
12. Prospect steers must be born in current year.

Each exhibitor is subject to the following "Declaration of Participation" in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Red Angus Association of America (RAAA):

"I/We, as exhibitor of Red Angus, having made entry application to any Red Angus show or exhibition do hereby agree:

- "To make our cattle available for any tests or examinations called for by authorized representatives of the RAAA or show officials with regard to acceptability of the cattle to be exhibited in the show".
- "To release the RAAA, its Board of Directors, staff and authorized representatives and any show staff / superintendents, from any claims for damages resulting from any such examinations or tests requested by authorized representatives of the Association or show officials".
- "To retain the right to challenge the results of any such examination or test in due course and under the provisions of the Right to Appeal, in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the RAAA".

Rules

1. American Royal entry forms properly filled out and accompanied by appropriate fees must be postmarked or submitted online on or before September 10th, 2023.
2. Exhibitors must be members of the Red Angus Association of America or national Junior Red Angus Association and be in good standing at the time of check-in.
3. All animals entered will have at least one owner on record as a Regular or Junior member of RAAA at the time of check-in.
4. Purebred females and bulls must be registered with the RAAA and meet all requirements for Category 1A or 1B at the time of the show's published entry deadline. Category 1A and 1B cattle will show together in the same class.

7. Substitutions may be permitted within sex.
8. All animals must have legible tattoos, which match the Animal ID and Herd Prefix as recorded in the RAAA database prior to processing.
 - a. Animal ID and Herd Prefix verification may be via printed registration certificate or real time electronic representation of the RAAA database.
 - b. If the Animal ID and /or Herd Prefix are not legible and cannot be read during processing, it will be allowed to participate in the show. A fee of \$100 will be charged to the exhibitor for a DNA parentage test of said animal. Red Angus Association Breeder's Guide RR-37.
 - c. If the Animal ID and /or Herd Prefix are legible, but are incorrect and/or no visible indications of a tattoo in either ear, the animal will not be allowed to show.
9. Each animal will be exhibited in its natural conformation and structure without any alterations or modifications, with the exception of acceptable fitting and grooming practices. No pumping.

10. The use of coloring agents, paints, and /or the addition of any hair or hair-like substances will not be allowed.
11. At the time of processing, all females 20 months of age or older on publicized date of show must have one of the following:
 - a. Certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian.
 - b. Written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist of having produced fertile eggs.

Simmental Rules

1. All bulls and females are subject to provisions and rules for showing as set forth by the Board of Directors of the Missouri Simmental Association and Progress Through Performance (PTP) rules of the American Simmental Association. Under the rules set forth by the PTP guidelines, the Missouri Simmental Association reserves the right to collect DNA from any or all animals for which entry applications are received. Verification of parentage will be done through the American Simmental Association and all discrepancies will be handled by them.
2. All animals must be registered with the American Simmental Association (ASA).
3. Open Show check-in will take place at the ASA booth. Exhibitors must present proof of registration on all entries being exhibited. Do not bring cattle to OPEN SHOW check-in. Any entry not checked in during this process will be considered a scratch.
4. ASA Staff and/or AJSA Trustees will verify tattoos on a random 10% of the animals checked in. This will take place in the exhibitors' stalls following the conclusion of check-in, unless otherwise announced. Any animal with a tattoo that does not match its registration will be automatically disqualified from the show.
5. Selected EPDs and the corresponding percentile ranks will be collected on each entry at, or prior to, the time of check-in. This information will be printed in the show program, with the date of collection displayed. Judge(s) will have access to EPDs and Percentile Ranks from the American Simmental Association to use in conjunction with visual appraisal. At the discretion of show officials, scrotal measurements and other data may also be collected at check-in and included in the show program.
6. All bulls 15 months of age and older (born before August 1, 2021) must have a semen test/breeding soundness exam and show to be satisfactory breeder. All bulls 12 months of age or older must be shown with a nose lead or ring. All females 18 months of age or older (born before May 1, 2021) must be certified pregnant by a licensed, non-owner veterinarian or have certification that she has been used in embryo transfer. Documentation on the above must be provided to an official Missouri Simmental Association representative.
7. All animals shall be subject to a medical examination by a competent veterinarian in order to determine age and the decision of the examining veterinarian is final with respect thereto.
8. No forced stomach filling by pump or any other means will be allowed. Animals, owners/exhibitors and fitters may be disqualified for such action.
9. The right to disqualify from show any animal deemed unmanageable is reserved by the Simmental Show Committee and the management of the American Royal.
10. Show management reserves the right to break classes, if deemed necessary, in which case the monies may be split.

11. Grand and Reserve Champions will have DNA samples pulled and tested for parentage and genomics. DNA collection will occur at the exhibition site and will be supervised and/or conducted by ASA staff. The Missouri Simmental Association reserves the right to draw blood and submit DNA samples on any animal in order to verify parentage. Any exhibitor, owner or representative who refuses to comply with this rule when asked by show officials to submit their animal(s) to DNA testing will be disqualified, premiums withheld and barred from future participation at the American Royal.

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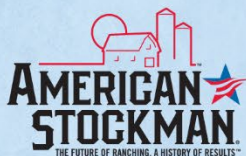


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
